

# LIBERALS SWEEP DOMINION

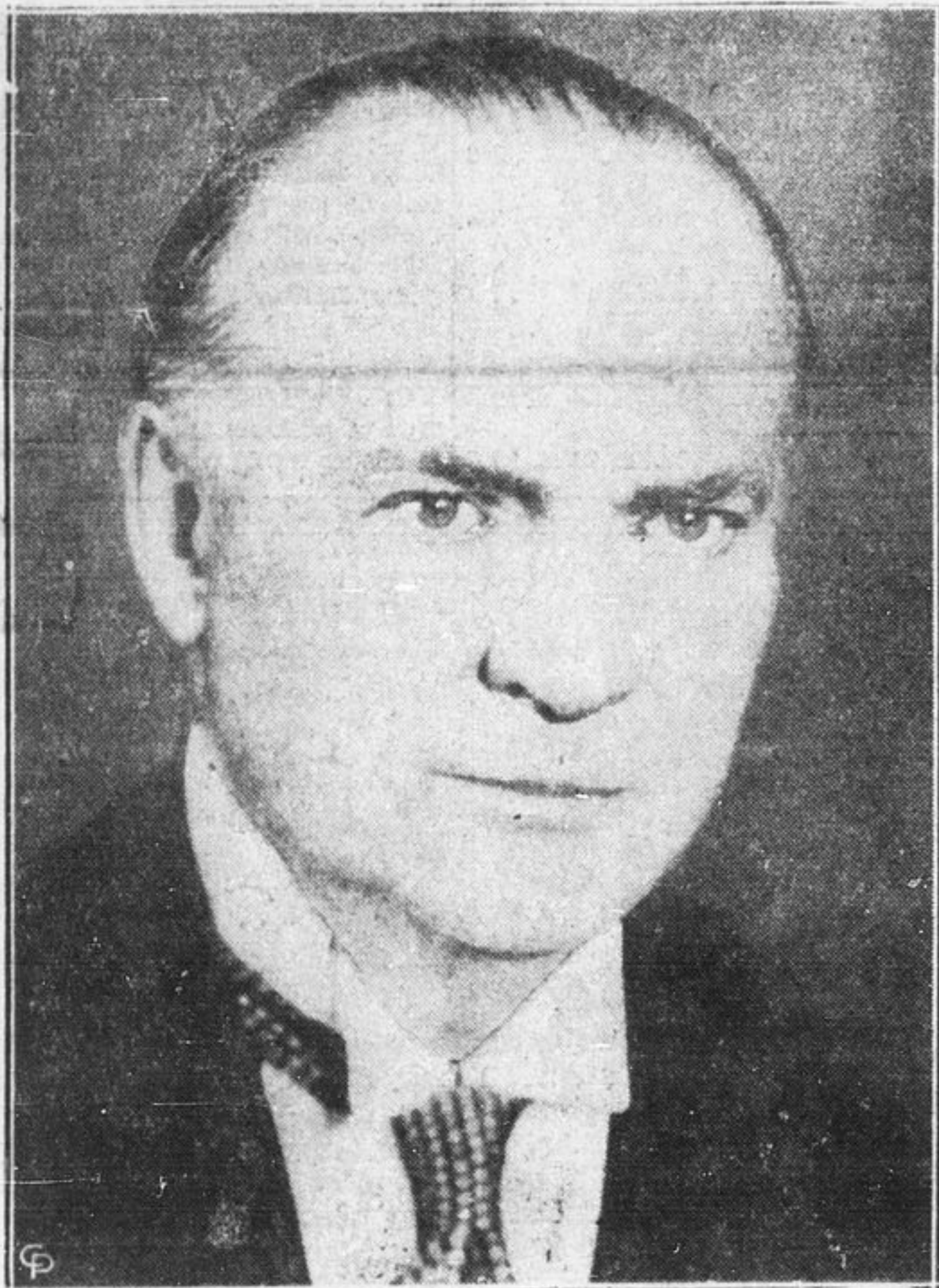
## Bradette's Majority Will be a Large One The New Parties Failed to Make a Good Showing

### Full List of Candidates on Pages Three and Four

First Complete List of Candidates for the Dominion Given Together by Provinces and Constituencies. This List Helps the Interest in the Returns Elsewhere.

To add to the information given in the returns as received and published herewith, a full list of the several candidates in each of the ridings in this Dominion election will be found on pages three and four of this issue. This is the first complete list of candidates published at the one time. Two or three separate lists have been published as the nominations in some constituencies were held previous to the general nominations. It is worth noting that probably for the first time in the history of the Dominion, there was not a single election by acclamation this election. In some ridings there were as many as ten candidates. The average number of candidates was four for every riding. Only in a few ridings were there two candidates only. A few had three candidates but the majority had four or five running. The riding of Cochrane had the average number of four candidates, though there was no Conservative nominee in this riding.

### NOTES

Both the Stevens party and the CCF failed to make much of a showing in the Dominion, though polling good votes in some ridings.

Election of J. S. Woodsworth, CCF leader in Winnipeg North Centre, was conceded around 8 p.m.

Constituencies won by Conservatives in Ontario: Carleton; Leeds; London; Ottawa East; Prince Edward; Hamilton East; Hamilton West.

Saint John, N.B.—Election of A. J. Brooks in Royal made him the only successful Conservative candidate in the Maritime Provinces. He has a majority of only 33 over Donald White, Liberal.

The final standing in N.B. was 9 Liberals and the lone Conservative. Among the defeated was Hon. R. B. Hanson, Minister of Trade and Commerce. All Stevens candidates in the province lost their deposits. Liberals retained two seats and gained seven from the Conservatives.

### Vote Through Dominion Swings to Liberal Party

Premier Bennett and Hon. Mr. King Both have Safe Majorities. No Stevens Candidates Reported Elected. Miss Agnes Macphail Wins Seat Again.

The Liberals made a big sweep in the voting to-day, and early in the returns it was evident that the Liberals were on the way to a decided victory. The results in Cochrane riding show that Jos. A. Bradette will have a majority running into the thousands. Returns so far are not complete, but indicate that the majority for Mr. Bradette will be in the thousands—considerably greater than in previous elections. Among the highlights of the election are:— The poor showing made by the Stevens party and the CCF. Hon. R. Geary lost his seat to Hugh Plaxton, Liberal lawyer, noted as hockey player. Miss Agnes Macphail was elected again.
