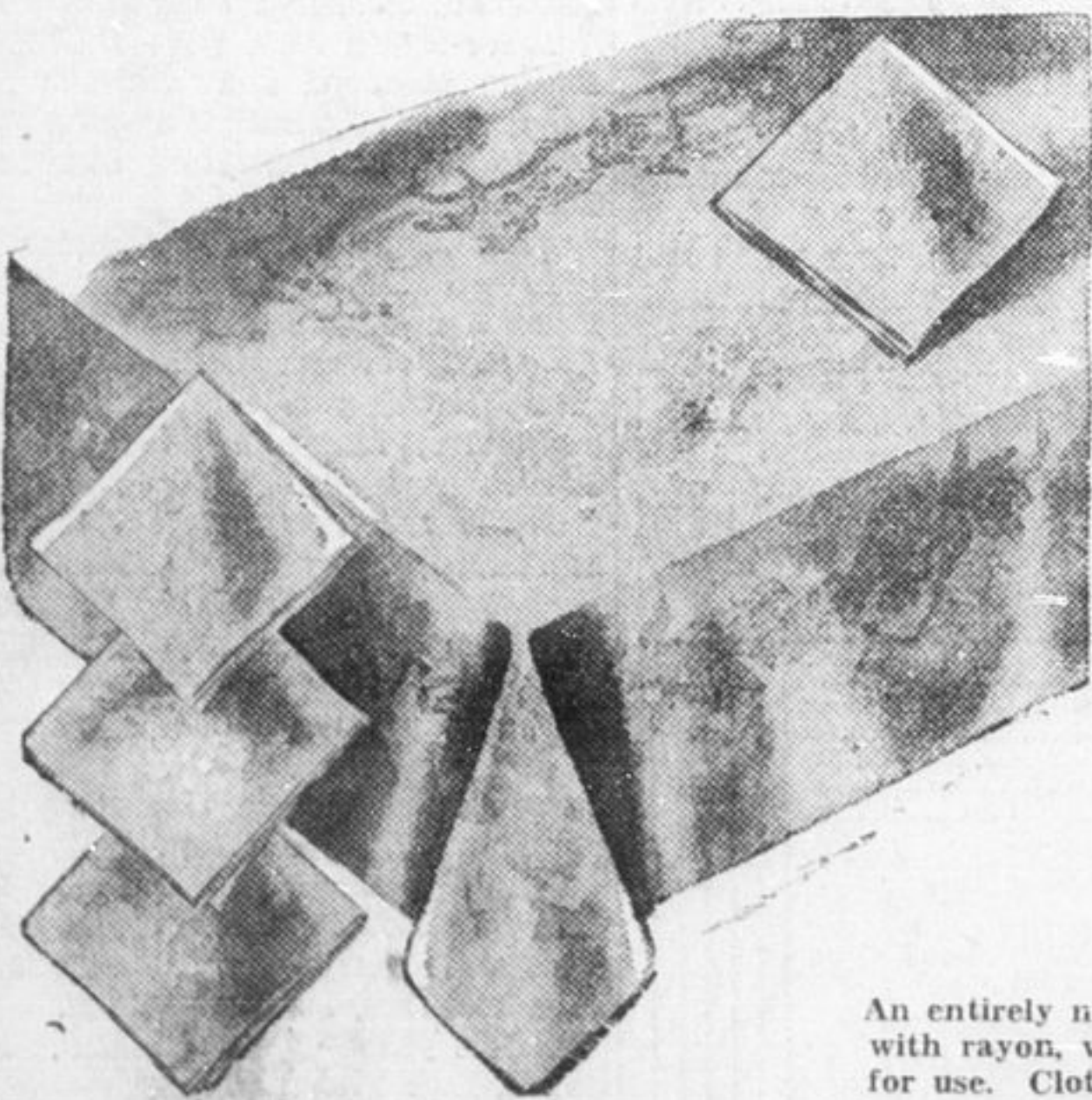

Accidental Death Verdict in Wile Case

Jury Finds No Blame Attached to Anyone in Death of Guilfred Wile on Oct. 4

"We, the jury, find that Guilfred Aubrey Wile came to his death at the Hollinger Mine on October 3rd, 1935, between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 8.00 o'clock a.m. October 4th. Cause of death, suffocation in sand raise, with

no blame attached to anyone." That was the verdict returned Thursday evening at six o'clock by a jury impaneled under Coroner H. E. Montgomery to inquire into the death of a Hollinger miner. Evidence presented by eight witnesses in less than an hour made the case quite clear.

Wile and his companion, W. Colborne, had been working near the top of a sand raise. Wile was about ten feet below the opening of the raise and had been wearing a life belt as required by mine regulations. "I think I'll take this thing off," said Wile, according to Colborne; "it's in

my road." He threw the life belt up above, out of reach. As Colborne turned around, he saw Wile's hand disappear under the sand. He raised an alarm and a small army of men were summoned to the spot. It was not until nine o'clock the next morning that the man's body was found.

Suffocation was the direct cause of death, Dr. J. W. A. Greig told the jury. Others who gave evidence in support of the facts as outlined were Eli Bigras, Capt. J. Disley, Louis Deroche, J. Elliott, Geo. Jones, and H. Hirschfeld.

Jurors were: I. E. Dunn, A. DesRoches, L. Hiam, H. N. Granville, J. Hobson, F. Adams, and E. Bowen. Assistant Crown Attorney Chas. A. Yates and Mines Inspector E. B. Weir assisted in the presentation of the evidence.

Pioneer of the North Dead at Kirkland Lake

Phillip (Silver) Lillie, one of the best known pioneers of the North, died at his home in Kirkland Lake on Thursday, October 10th, aged 61 years. He had an interesting and colourful career, setting out on life as a page in the House of Commons at Ottawa in the days of Sir John A. Macdonald. He was ambitious and enterprising and studied engineering in his spare time and when he graduated he came north. He had been a resident of Kirkland Lake for the past 16 years and was well known to all connected with the mining industry. He had pioneered in many of the mining areas of the North and had lived a long and useful life. One sister, Mrs. Sullivan, New Liskeard, is the only known relative surviving. The funeral was held from the Thorpe funeral chapel on Friday afternoon at 2.30 p.m., Rev. S. Barr conducting services at the chapel and at the graveside in Kirkland Lake district cemetery.
