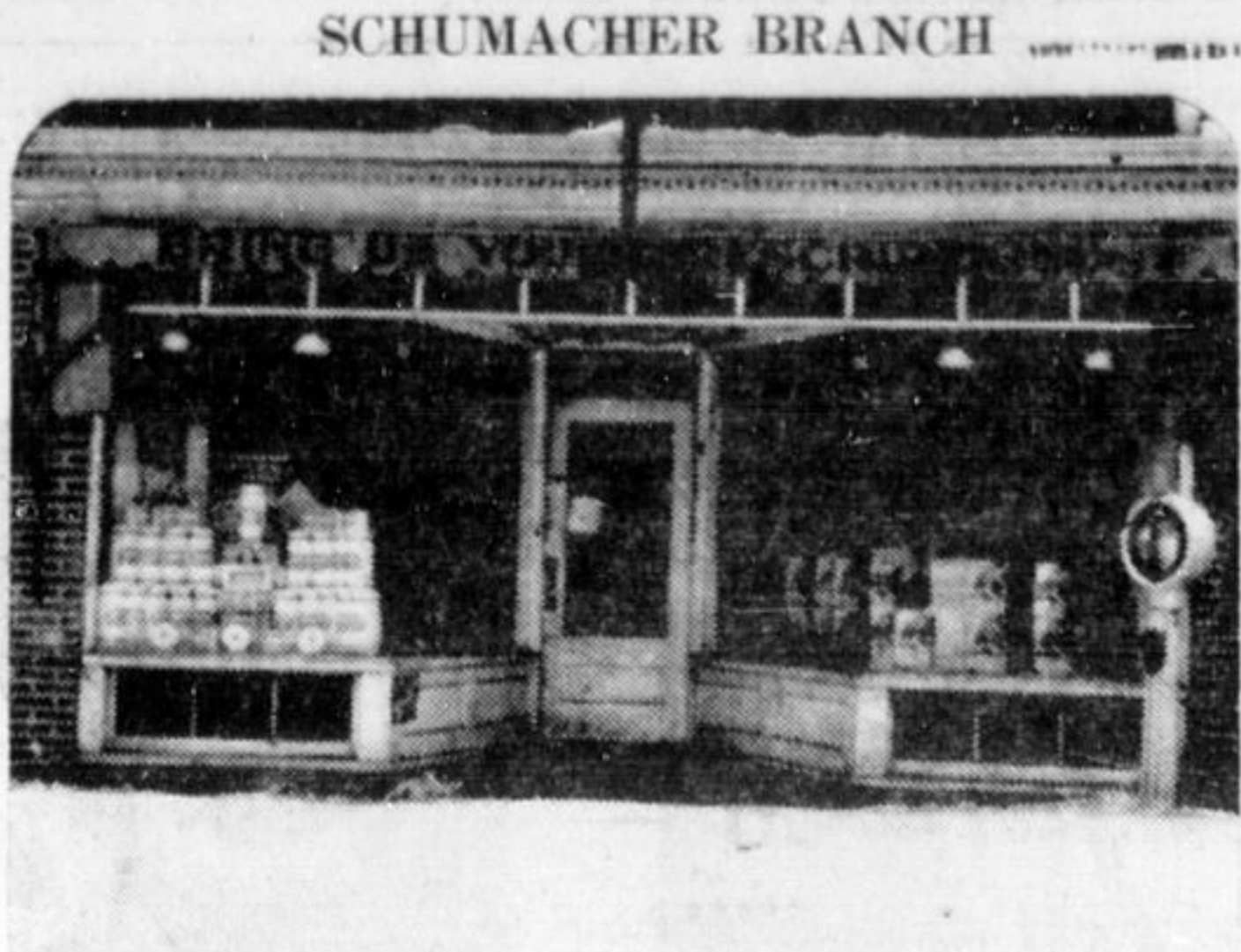

Haileybury Bears Do Not Live up to Popular Ideas

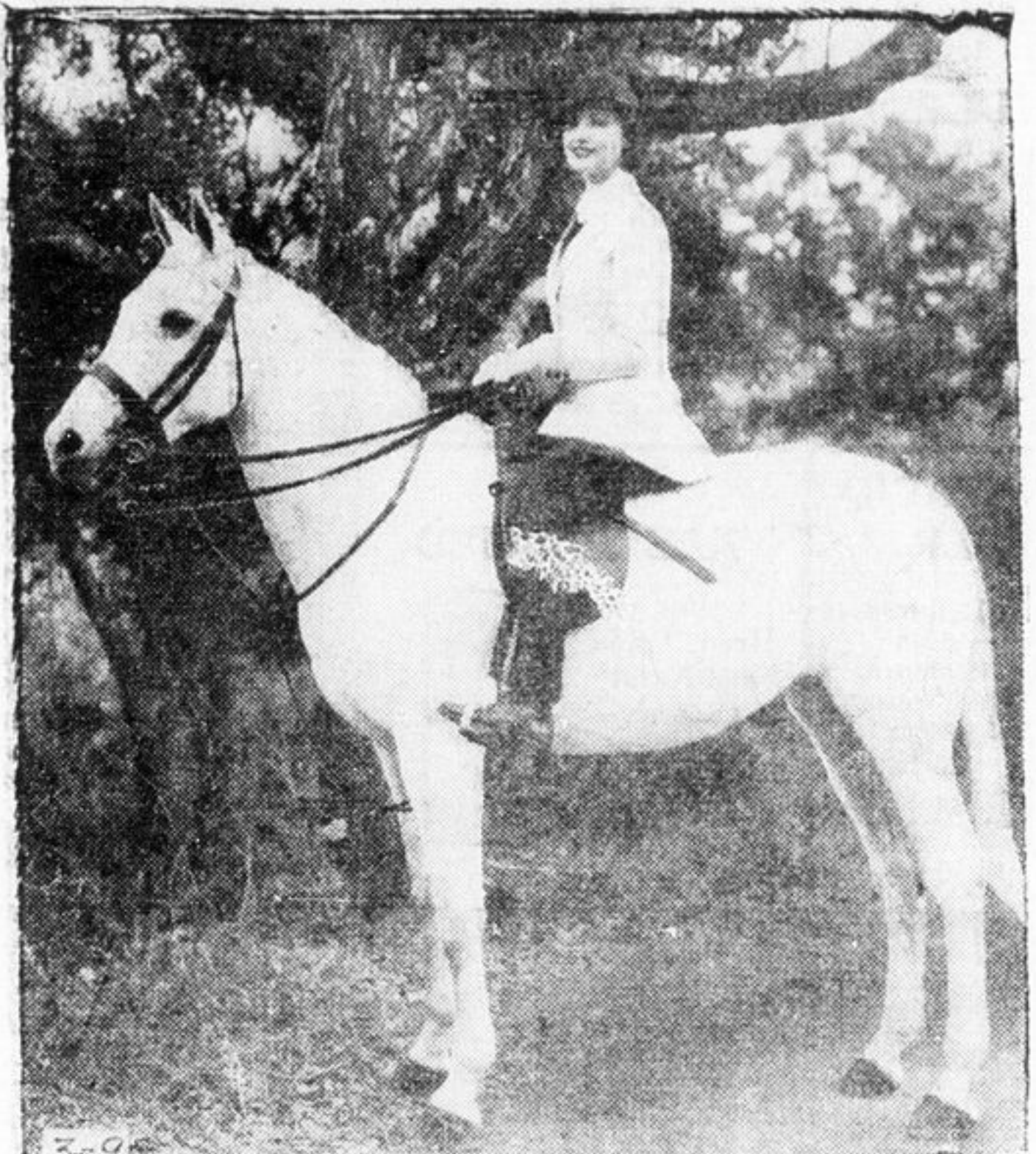

Coniaurum Mine Ore Reserves Increased

Annual Reports Show Broken Ore Reserves Greater than Previous Year. Profit for 1935, \$30,947.

Coniaurum Mines, Ltd., in its report for the year ended Dec. 31, 1935, shows profit transferred to surplus account of \$30,947. During the year the company milled 151,053 tons of ore and produced 32,151 ounces of gold and 6,026 ounces of silver valued at \$1,124,596 from which is deducted marketing costs of \$13,722, leaving net return of \$1,120,874. Operating and administrative costs totalled \$947,011 leaving operating profit at \$173,862 to which is added non-operating revenue of \$30,388 making total of \$204,250. After deducting \$3,535 as provision for taxes, \$151,055 deferred development written off and \$91,951 as reserves for depreciation, the company shows a net loss for the year of \$41,291, with the profit of \$73,238 realized from the sale of securities however, the company turned its loss into a profit of \$30,947 as shown above.

The balance sheet as of Dec. 31, shows current assets at \$922,559, of which \$238,776 is cash and \$104,678 in bullion settlements outstanding. Investments in bonds and sundry shareholdings total \$507,590. Current liabilities are shown at \$71,093.

John Redington, mine manager, in his report states that broken ore reserves are greater than those of last year and are now 200,067 tons. Stopping supplied 199,357 tons and development 17,622 tons. Unbroken ore reserves are estimated at 171,320 tons having an average value of 4.1 dwts. per ton.

Developments in various parts of the mine consisted of considerable lateral work, as well as sinking and raising. The Bishop or main shaft now has reached a depth of 3700 feet. Two new levels have been established, the 3,250 and 3,500 foot. In addition a winze is being put down near the east boundary of the West Goldale claim and has reached a depth of 900 feet below the 3,000-foot horizon. Considerable amount of drifting and cross-cutting has been done on the 1,000, 1,750, 2,000, 3,000 and 3,500-foot levels. Veins Nos. 7, 25, and 26 have been indicated on the 3,500 foot level and now are under exploration.

Negotiating Deal for the Financing of the Canusa

Shareholders of Canusa Gold Mines, Limited, at a special general meeting in Toronto, ratified a by-law to increase the company's authorized capitalization from 1,500,000 shares to 4,500,000 shares, \$1 par value. This action cancelled a resolution passed in November to increase capitalization to 3,000,000 shares.

The meeting was told that the sum of \$10,000, secured by mortgage on the property, which was borrowed late in 1935 had been repaid and the mortgage cancelled, says The Northern Miner. Good progress had been made in reducing the company's indebtedness, it was stated, and at the present time amounts due to creditors were not over \$10,000, as compared with some \$30,000 18 months ago. \$115,000 on the property falls due in December, 1936.

Directors had under negotiation an agreement whereby a prominent company, which was not named, would assume direction of mining operations, and would option the newly-created treasury stock for a total amount of \$480,000, if all of the shares were taken up.

Briefly reviewing the mine situation, Robert Schram, a director, stated that the shaft was 319 feet in depth and that approximately 2000 feet of lateral work had been completed.
