During an Illness Perhaps you wonder why the physiyoung or old—in bed during an illness The patient is recovering rapidly and feels that if he could get up and around his appetite would improve, the bowels would act regularly and would regain his strength in much less time Now this would all be true if it were not for one important organ of the oody—the heart.

Even if no treatment were given in various ailments, except that the patients remained in bed, the chances are that they would recover in due time, as most ailments run a more or less definite course. However whether the patient is to recover or not doesn't depend so much on the disease as it does upon how the heart is able to keep up the extra work that is put upon it. If the heart is very strong it is possible that even if the patient gets up before he should he will likely get along all right and no real damage will be done.


