¼ cup lemon juice 1 cup unsweetened stewed fresh

rhubarb 24 vanilla wafers

Blend together sweetened condensed nilk and lemon juice. Add prepared fruit. Line narrow colong pan or pring-form cake pan with wax paper. Cover with fruit mixture. Add layer of wafers, alternating in this way until fruit mixture is used, finishing with layer of wafers. Let stand in refrigerator for six hours or more. To serve, turn out on small platters and carefully remove wax paper. Cut in slices and serve plain. Serves eight.
