Some Facts Often Forgotten About the Wedding Ring

Swinburne says Rebecca was the first bride to wear a wedding ring.
That Egyptians used the ring for a marriage symbol to represent the circle, or eternity.
That the Greeks believed in the existence of a direct communication between the heart and the ring finger. A certain vein of blood passing directly from the finger to the heart occasioned a peculiar intimacy and sympathy between the finger and the seat of affection.
That in Greek, Roman, early French and English wedding rings, symbolic portraits or "poesy" expressed the sentiment of the individuals or some particular part of the marriage vows.

Mr. and Mrs. Dionne Married 11 Years

Parents of Famous Quintuplets Observed Anniversary This Week.

Tuesday of this week, September 15, Mr. and Mrs. Oliva Dionne, parents of the famous quintuplets at Callender, observed the eleventh anniversary of their wedding day.
Oliva Dionne and Elzire Legros were married at Sacred Heart Church, Corbell, on September 15th, 1925, by Rev. Fr. Daniel Breen. After a wedding trip to Mechina, Quebec, the bridegroom, then 22 years of age, and his bride, aged 17 years, returned to their farm, where Oliva was born. Since then their farm home has become famous as the birthplace of the quintuplets, who were born on May 28th, 1934. Besides the famous five girls, the Dionnes have six children—Ernest, Rose, Therese, Daniel and Pauline, who were living when the quintuplets were born—and Oliva, Jr., born July 9th, 1936. Another child, Leo, died in infancy.

Suggestions for Colour Schemes, Furniture, Etc.

(From Canadian Homes and Gardens)
Question.—My new summer cottage will contain one small screened-in front porch, a living room 32 by 18 feet, with hardwood floor, walls of knotty white pine, with alternate boards slightly wider, and in Flemish brown colour. The ceiling will be cream or buff ashlarblock wallboard. This is the only room to be finished at the present time. It has a good-sized stone fireplace at one end. The entire front and side opposite the fireplace will be almost entirely made up of large windows. There will be a stairway leading to four bedrooms upstairs. In addition to the living room and screened porch downstairs, there will be a dining room, a glassed-in porch for serving meals, kitchen, one large bedroom and a utility room.
I would appreciate suggestions for furniture, colour schemes, and any ideas you care to pass along. The effect must be practical, comfortable and not too expensive in the obtaining. The

outside of the cottage will be finished with siding designed to imitate logs—A. H. Sault Ste. Marie, Ont.

Answer.—Good hearty colours, yellow and red and brown, with touches of soft green, might be brought together attractively in your large summer living room. To avoid expensive curtaining for so many windows, you might investigate the possibilities of linen or cotton sacking, the kind that is frequently used to "cotton" plaster walls before painting. This has been successfully used for simple curtains; we have seen it in ecru and in brown. Theatrical gauze makes a delightful, crisp curtain treatment; it is inexpensive too. Yellow or brown sailcloth is another possibility, both for curtains and for chair coverings, cushions, etc. Your furniture requirements could be met very nicely by a few comfortable upholstered pieces and some of the new Canadian-made Colonial maple shown in all the shops—this latter for small tables, side chairs, Windsor chairs, etc. This is quite inexpensive. There are attractive suites in these lines for the small dining room and for the bedroom, too, and they would be quite at home in the type of summer cottage which you are planning. Then, too, you might look into the various lines of unfinished pieces, especially for dining porch and for bedrooms. These can be stained and lightly varnished, or can be painted or enameled as you wish. For instance, for the four upstairs bedrooms, you might like to have low poster or spool beds (both are available) and finish each in a different colour, and develop the room around that colour; a yellow room with yellow bed and dresser, blue and yellow cotton fabrics for spread and curtains; another room with Chinese red bed and dresser, and red and white gingham at windows and for spread; and so on.

The main point to keep in mind in furnishing a summer cottage is to have everything simple, useful and cheery. The new types of fibre and hemp matting would be ideal for rugs in the main rooms. You can get it in plain or patterned effects; we like it best in block patterns, natural and brown. In the bedrooms, cheap braided mats or strips of rag carpeting would be appropriate with either painted or maple furnishings. The Quebec-made catalogue carpet would be most attractive on your stairway.

Dominion to Allow the Entry of Russian Coal

A quota of 250,000 metric tons of Russian coal per annum has been agreed to by Canada and importation up to this maximum forms one of the most important features of the new understanding reached between the Dominion and Soviet Russia. This was indicated in a statement issued by "Tass," official Soviet news agency, and made public at Ottawa Sunday.

The understanding implies certain restrictions, however. Prior to the imposition by Canada of the embargo on Russian coal imports in February, 1931, the Soviet exporting agency had one

distributor in Canada. Under the new agreement, Russian coal will be offered for distribution to various firms and will be retailed in Canada on a competitive basis.

Coal will not be shipped for consumption in the maritime provinces. A metric ton is equal to one and one-tenths of a "short" ton, approximately. Prior to the 1931 embargo, for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1931, Canada imported 284,721 short tons of Russian coal. Thus, the maximum which may be imported annually within the terms of the new understanding is about 9700 short tons below the 1931 imports.
