



Mike Brennan is an Irishman whose worked from time to time in the great timber limits of Oregon. Mike has a sense of humour.

While in Oregon, once, he found some obsidian arrow heads and other artifacts which he, as most people do, treasured as a link with the men that once roamed North America in happy hunting tribes.
