 On the grandstand packed row on row sat the school children, with a platform erected in front, and a flag wrapped for "breaking." This was done to "O Canada," by the Chief Scouts.
 The Archdeacon gave an address stressing loyalty to the King and Throne, and stating that as time goes

on the love of the people grows stronger for a king and throne whose greatness is based on service to the Empire.
King Scout Badges Presented
 The presentation of King Scout Badges was among the most interesting features of the day. In 1909 King Edward VII requested that Chief Scout Baden-Powell create a rank to be known as King Scout, and that it be open to all Scouts of First Class rank who hold four of six public service badges as chosen by King Edward VII. There were seven Scouts decorated with the rank of King Scout at South Porcupine on Coronation Day. They are the first in the region of King George VI. Each Scout so honoured receives a Coronation King Scout certificate signed by the Governor-General, a King

Scout badge, and a gold Scout badge.
