

Over 100 Events on Field Day Programme July 1st

Timmins Police Amateur Athletic Association in Charge of Field and Track Events at McIntyre Park on Dominion Day. Programme and Times Given Herewith.

With no less than 110 events on the programme, the field day at McIntyre park on July 1st is the biggest undertaking of its sort ever to have been attempted here. Timmins Police Amateur Athletic Association officials have been placed in charge of track and field events for the day by the Lions Club of Timmins as part of the celebration of Timmins Silver Jubilee and Porcupine Old Home Week.

There are races and field events for everyone from six and seven years of age upward. Times have been fixed for each event, as shown in the list published here, and the races must get away on time, according to those in charge. If an entrant arrives even a few seconds too late for the particular heat in which he intended to enter, there is no way of entering the second heat.

The first event of the programme begins at nine o'clock in the morning. The last will not be completed until five o'clock in the evening.

Already there are 200 of the Junior T.P.A.A.A. boys entered in events. Others wishing to enter, particularly in the "open" division, should get in touch with Jack Gorman at T.P.A.A.A. headquarters at the rear of 3 Balsam street north. Athletes of Timmins, Schumacher, South Porcupine, Iroquois Falls, Cochrane, Kapuskasing, Smooth Rock Falls and Kirkland Lake are expected to be at the McIntyre on July 1st. Entries for junior, intermediate and senior events close Saturday; for open events, Monday.

Age is taken at May 1st for these classifications: "juniors" boys under 15; "intermediates" boys under 17; "seniors" boys under 20.

International Football Game to be Played at McIntyre, Instead of Dome. Medals.

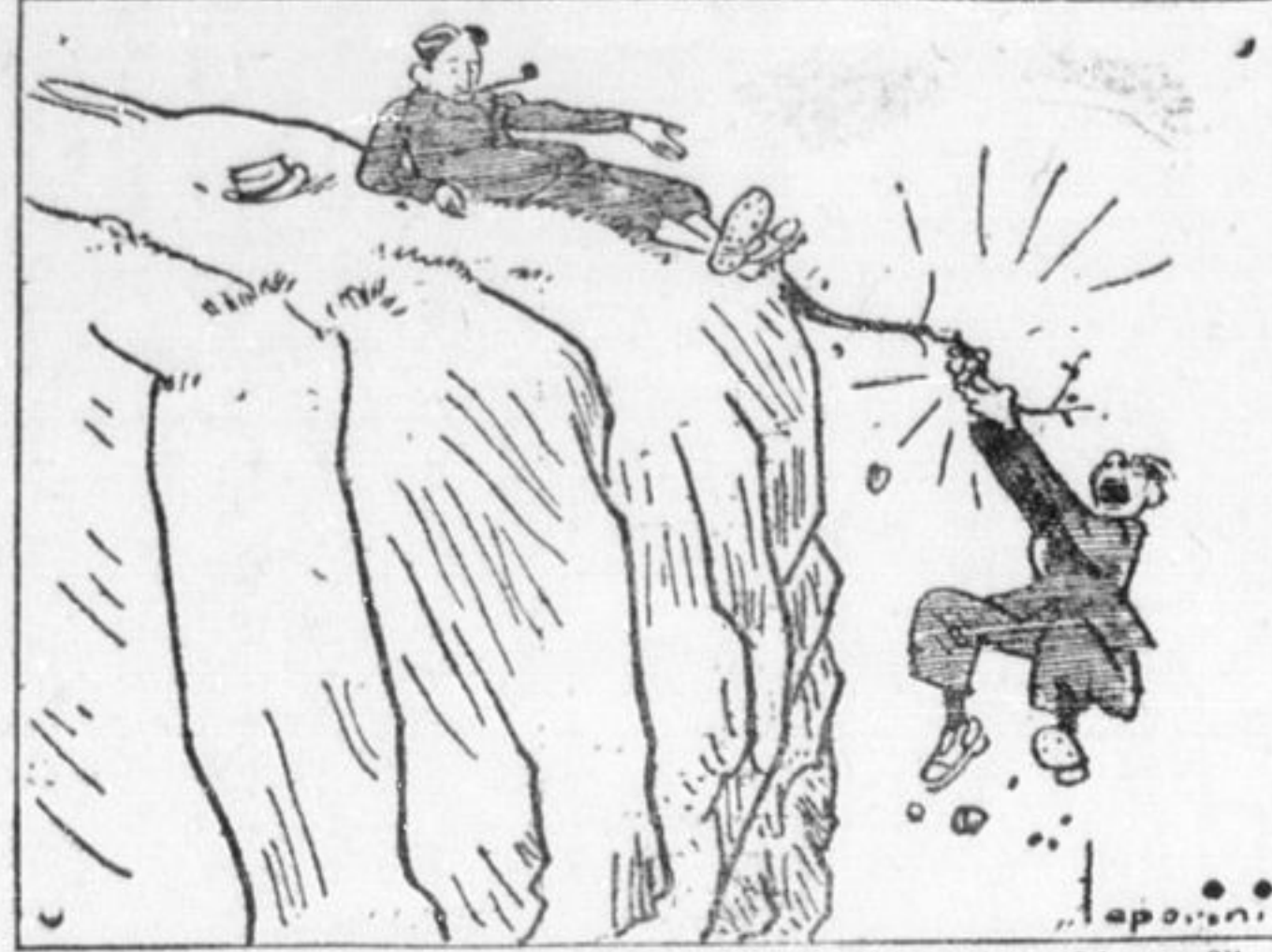

Virita Porcupine Enters the Larder Lake District
