Premier Announces New Cabinet Line-up

Eight New Men Included in
Hepburn Government.

Tuesday night word over the radio said that Premier Hepburn had announced his new Cabinet. Despatches by wire yesterday morning confirmed this. Premier Hepburn's new Ontario Cabinet was announced as follows:—

- Prime Minister and Provincial Treasurer—Mr. Hepburn.
- Provincial Secretary and Minister of Games and Fisheries—Hon. Harry C. Nixon.
- Attorney-General—Hon. Gordon Conant.
- Public Works—Hon. Colin A. Campbell.
- Municipal Affairs and Welfare—Hon. Eric W. Cross.
- Highways—Hon. T. B. McQueen.
- Mines—Hon. Paul Leduc.
- Agriculture—Hon. P. M. Dewan.
- Lands and Forests—Hon. Peter Heenan.
- Education—Hon. L. J. Simpson.
- Health—Hon. Harold J. Kirby.
- Labour—Hon. M. M. MacBride.
- Without Portfolio—Hon. W. L. Houck.
- Without Portfolio—Hon. A. St. Clair.

Premier Hepburn announced appointment of Mr. Houck to the Ontario Hydro-Electric Power Commission. Mayor J. A. Smith of Kitchener, Liberal member-elect for Waterloo North, also has been appointed to the Hydro Commission, the Premier said.

For some time previous to the election the Cabinet had been "short-handed"—due in part to the dropping of Hon. A. W. Roebuck from the Attorney-General's Department, and the retirement of Hon. David Croll from the position of Minister of Welfare and Municipal Affairs. In the election Hon. Dr. Faulkner, Minister of Health, was defeated, making another vacancy. The announcement of the new Cabinet was not expected for some days, but as usual Premier Hepburn made up his mind quickly. There is understood to be a possibility, however, that there may be further changes and re-arrangement in the Cabinet and departments, so the editorial in another section of The Advance is not necessarily outdated. This editorial being in the second section of this issue was written and in type before word reached here of the announcement by the premier.

It will be noted that there are eight new men in the Cabinet. These are:—Hon. Gordon Conant, Hon. Eric W. Cross, Hon. P. M. Dewan, Hon. Colin A. Campbell, Hon. Harold Kirby, Hon. M. M. MacBride, Hon. W. L. Houck and Hon. A. St. Clair. Gordon Conant, the new attorney-general, is a lawyer of marked ability and standing. He carried the riding of Ontario, in which is situated the town named Oshawa, made famous by the C.I.O. trouble in the province. Hon. Colin A. Campbell, who was generally expected as likely to be Minister of Mines, will have to be provided with a seat, having lost out in the election. He is a well-known mining engineer. The other new men are also prominent and well-known and the general opinion is that the new Cabinet is likely to prove a strong and effective one, especially if a change or two takes place later.

Victim of Accident Laid to Rest at Shawville

Shawville, Que., Oct. 12.—(Special)—The funeral of James Horner, who was killed near South Porcupine early on Saturday morning, was held from the home of his sister, Mrs. Harry Hodgins, on the Portage du Fort road, Monday afternoon to St. Paul's Anglican Church, Shawville. The pastor, Rev. T. E. R. Nurse, conducted the service, assisted by Rev. J. Liggett, of the Portage du Fort Anglican Church.

Mr. Horner was born at Radford, Que., 23 years ago. For the last four years he has worked in the mines at South Porcupine. His car was in collision with a truck on Saturday morn-

ing, and he died shortly after reaching the hospital.

He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Ed. Horner, of Radford, and there is left to mourn his loss four brothers, Sherman, of Sudbury; Melbourne, Marshall and Hubert, of South Porcupine, and two sisters, Mrs. Harry Hodgins, of Clarendon, and Mrs. Clifford Fulford, of Stark's Corners, Que. Interment was made in the village cemetery.

Remand Lavoie Case to Spring Assizes

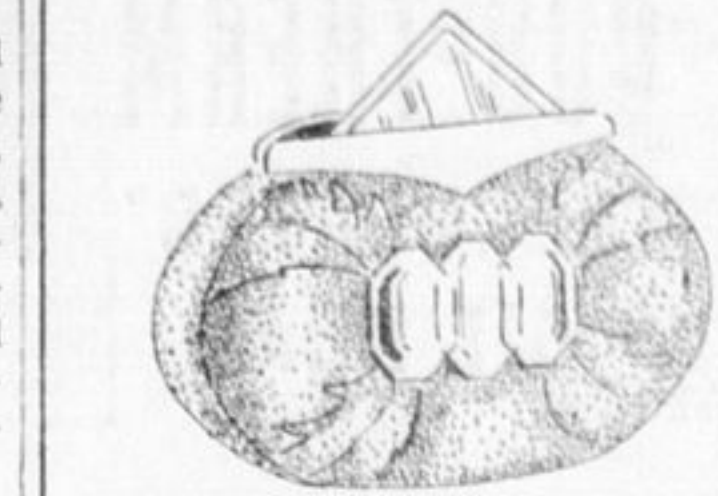
Faces Two Charges of Car Theft and One of Jail Breaking. Did Not Have Counsel.

Charges of automobile theft and jail breaking against Wilfred Lavoie of Timmins, which were scheduled to be heard at the fall assizes at Cochrane last week, have been postponed until spring.

Lavoie broke jail in Timmins when awaiting a hearing before the magistrate on a charge of automobile theft. He is alleged to have stolen an automobile in Schumacher after the jail break. He was captured after a furious chase, in the city, by Toronto police.

Back in jail again in Timmins Lavoie was brought before Magistrate Atkinson. He chose trial by a higher court, and was taken to Halleybury to await trial at Cochrane at the fall assizes by Mr. Justice Meakins and a jury.

When his case was called in Cochrane on Thursday of last week Lavoie did not have counsel. He asked the court to provide one. The court would
