Up till lately, you were expected to consume whatever it paid the . producer to provide you with, you were his "market," and by a judicious application of the right kind of publicity, it was often considered that you could be got to buy anything, regardless of whether you could use it or not.

Now we see a Consumers Bureau established by the State of Michigan to protect the interests of that class of its citizens which includes all of them, in addition to the various departments of state which exist for the assistance of part of them, like the department of insurance, or of agriculture.

And in New York, a proposal has recently been made that the State Government set up a "DEPARTMENT of the CONSU-

Of course, all this is happening because the Consumer discovered himself first, before the Governments did, by forming his own Consumers Cooperative Societies, to protect his own interests as Consumer, and now that he has proved that he exists, Governments are finding him out too.


