The new fire pumper purchased early this year for Timmins fire department, arrived in town this morning and was given its first test in a demonstration at Mattagami River this after-

The new piece of fire fighting equipment, massive in design and modern in every detail, cost \$15,000. It has a capacity of pumping 1,000 gallons per minute and is equipped with a 240-horsepower, 12 cylinder engine. The pump will accommodate four lines of hose using nozzles 11% of an inch in diameter, or six lines using one-inch nozzles. Two thousand feet of hose are carried on the pumper at all times. Included in the equipment of the pumper, is an 80-gallon water tank, which will be used in attending to fires of small proportions. Pressure is supplied by an independent pump.
