

Howard, Manager, Tourist and Convention Bureau of the Canadian National Railways, to make arrangements for sending a wolf team down to these American cities for the shows next winter. "And I'm going to be there, and with a team" Joe triumphantly stated. Just now he is on the hunt for a new team, his old one being played out. Joe said he knows of two timber wolves in Saskatchewan and he is endeavouring to get them. Between now and October he hopes to collect about five from the Sudbury area, which, linked with the other two he hopes to get, will give him a seven wolf


