## Dr. Legatt Banquetted at Iroquois Falls by Friends

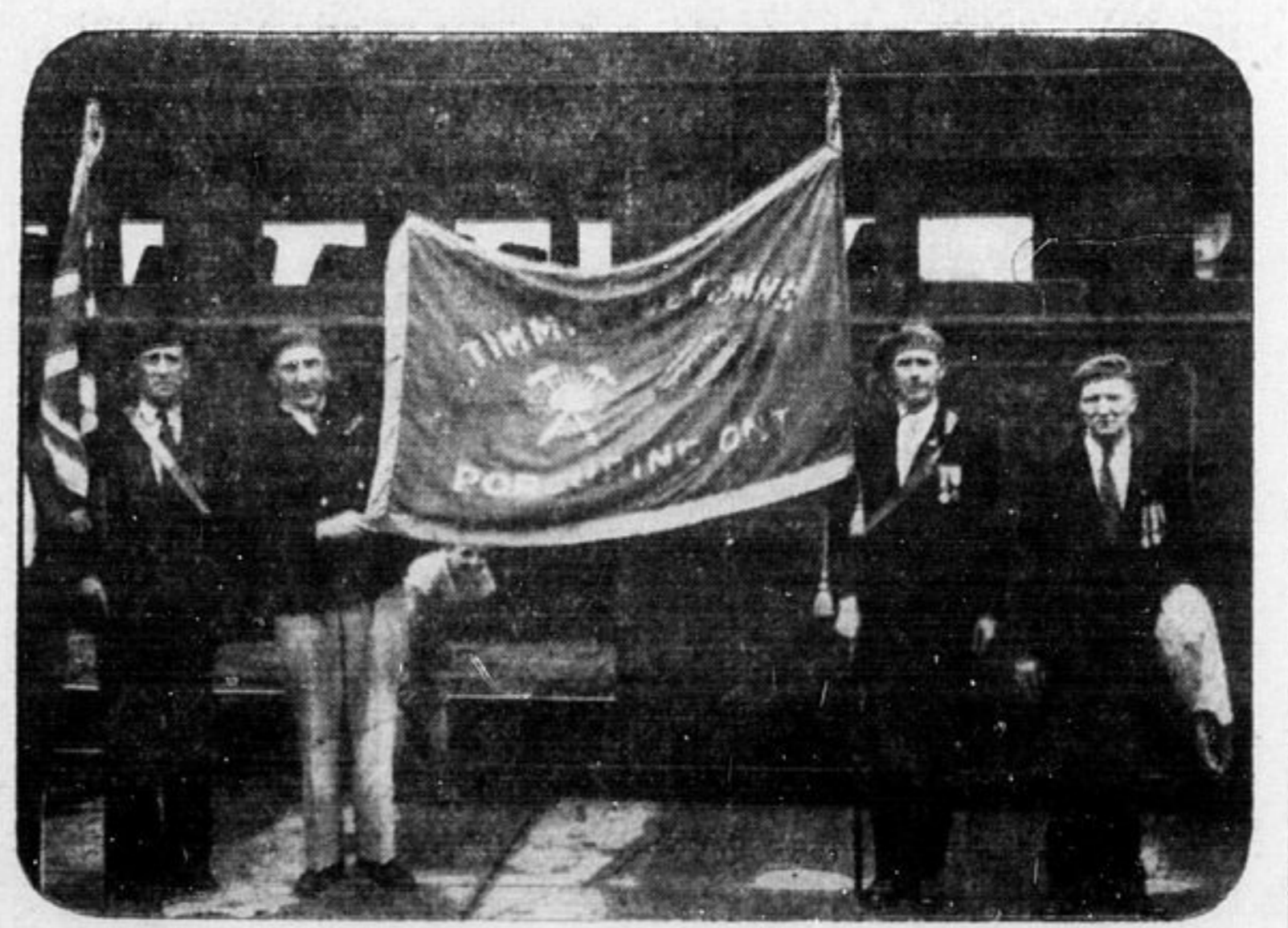
