Canada in Second Place in Gold Output

Rate of Increae in Advance of All Other Nations.

Gold production in Canada set a new monthly record in June, and at the same time the increase in output for the first half of the year was at a faster rate than that of any other of the major producing countries. The volume of production placed the Dominion in second place, ahead of the United States for the first time since 1934. Russia is excluded owing to lack of data, from the record of the American Bureau of Statistics.

As the "other fellow" happened to be two Provincial Police highway patrolmen who clocked Dube at 72 miles an hour. Magistrate Tucker did not long ponder the case before finding the accused guilty and imposing a fine totalling \$32.75 and suspending his driving permit for two months.


