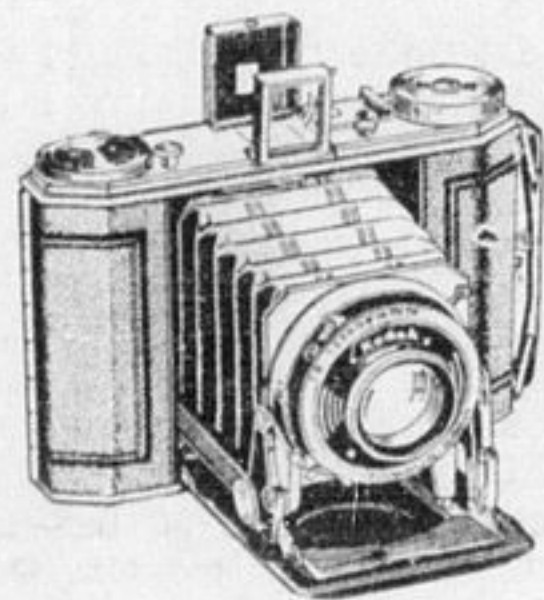

Indiana Finds Method for Curbing the Bank Robber

This is the first year in more than 15 years that no daylight robbery has been attempted at an Indiana bank. "The Indiana Bankers' Association started the movement that drove bank robbers out of this state," explains the Indianapolis News. "A citizens committee, headed by Felix M. McWhirter, then president of the association, raised \$30,000 and donated it to the state to help defray the expense of installing a state-wide police radio system. Since then many banks have come under federal protection because their deposits are insured by the government. The police radio network, the increased activity of state police and the co-operation between federal operatives and law enforcement agencies of nearby states make it nearly impossible for a daylight bandit to rob a bank in Indiana and escape."

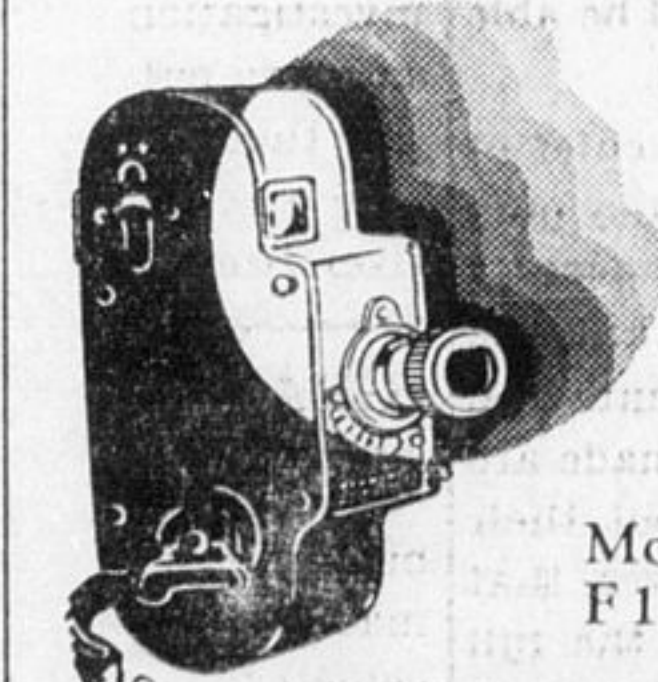

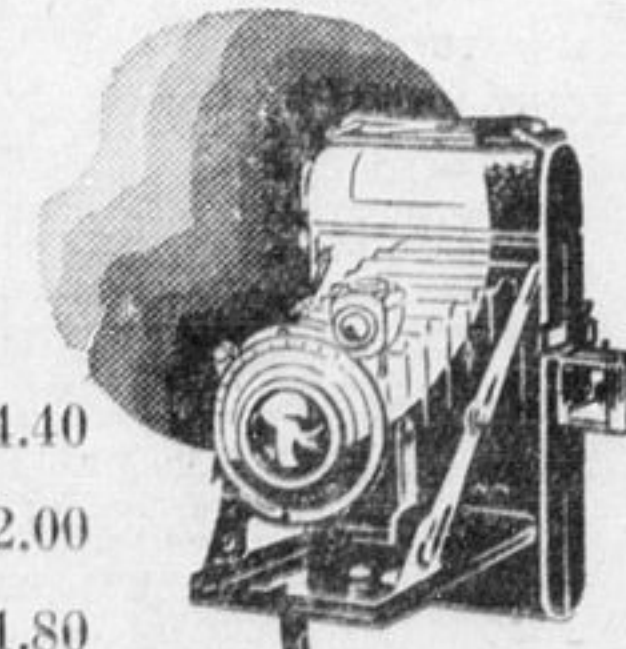
