Canadian Minister to U.S. Sued for \$300,000 by Son

Leonard Marler, son of Sir Herbert Marler, Canadian Minister to the United States, is suing his father, claiming damages to the amount of \$300,000. The writ issued by Leonard Marler is issued against his father, Sir Herbert, and against Dr. Geo. H. Stevenson, psychiatrist, and superintendent of the Ontario Hospital at London, Ont.

The plaintiff's claim is to the effect that the defendants wilfully and by collusion, caused him to be detained in the Ontario Mental hospital at London. Ont., from Feb. 17th, 1938, to Sept. 20th, 1938, a period of over seven months. During that time, the plaintiff alleges, he was deprived of his liberty and other with work gangs in the hospital. He also contends that steps were taken by one or other of the two defendants, or both, to hinder his intended marriage, although the said marriage was duly authorized by the issuer of marriage licenses at London, Ont., on Feb. 8th.

Threatened Canton China's Modern City

Canton," Say the Chinese.

Japanese troops, in their drive on 30 Canton, have been attacking not only 25 the "capital city" and the chief port of 29 South China, but a city which has won 21 a wide reputation during the last de-25 cades as China's most progressive and 60 modern city.

Peopled by 900,000 human beings, of 85 whom 400,000 have been frantically 5 evacuated by local authorities in pre-8 paration for another period of turmoil 45 and bloodshed. Canton's rise as a mod-65 ern metropolis is linked closely with 31 the rise in importance of Britain's 28 Hong Kong. Hong Kong, an island off 8 the South China coast in the estuary 25 of the Pearl River, is but 111 miles 15 away from Canton by rail.

The world's largest shipments of wolframite, from which tungsten for electric light bulb filaments, and alloy 22 steels is extracted, pass through Can-9 ton, Science Service points out. 67 comes from Kwangtung Province, Can-08 ton's hinterland.

Broad streets, steel bridges, city parks and other modern western improvements give this still Oriental-appearing city a distinctly unusual flavor. The city's real name is Kwankchow. which means capital of Kwangtung. The word "Canton" itself is an anglicized corruption of Kwangtung.

"Everything New Begins in Canton"

Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek, commanded a nearby military school Whampon Military Academy.

Canton was the scene of the shortlived "Canton Commune" in 1928, a "Everything New Begins in Communist-led insurrection that came after the break between the Communists and the Chinese Nationalist Kuomintang. It was 70 years before that the Tai-pings, the Chinese revolutionists of another day, swept northward out of Canton to give the Peking government and plenty of foreigners the worst scare they had had up until that

In keeping not only with this history and with Canton's progressiveness, Chinese have long remarked "everything new begins in Canton."

The city is located on the Pearl River just above the point where the West River, the lifeline of South China, is joined by the Pearl. It is centred in an extremely rich agricultural district.

Meets Death in Explosion at Yellowknike Last Week

Yellowknife, N.W.T., Oct. 18 .- One man was killed and the warehouse of the Morrissette Diamond Drilling Company was wrecked by explosion followed by fire here Sunday.

Dorius Richer, manager at this mining town 675 air miles north of Edmonton, was missing after the explosion.

A dismembered body found in the building later was believed to be that of Richer. The home office of the company is at Haileybury, Ont.
