### Large Attendance at the Citizens' League

Several Speakers Touch on Topics of Interest.

There were several speakers at the meeting of the Citizens' League last night, the town hall council chamber being crowded beyond seating capacity for the occasion. Mr. Tesser spoke on the "two weeks' holiday with pay" idea, while Mr. W. Armstrong quoted from government blue books to show the amount of taxes paid to the governments by the Hollinger and the small percentage of these taxes that apportioned to the town by the governments. He also noted that the Hollinger pays taxes on all the houses and other property owned in town, giving \$68,000 a year as the amount of these taxes. Mr. Nap Caron, speaking in French, referred to the town manager idea, pointing out that it seemed an unnecessary extra expense if mayor and council were functioning properly. Mr. E. H. Chateauvert thought separate school taxes were too high and urged separate school supporters to study the question and seek to have the taxes reduced. President Homer Gauthier urged all the members of the Citizens' League to attend the labour union meeting called for Sunday to discuss municipal matters. After that meeting the Citizens' League could decide whether it was well or not to affiliate with the labour union group in municipal affairs this year.
