One of the younger school of architects, Mr. Kaminker entered the course of architecture in the faculty of applied science and engineering at the University of Toronto in 1926. In the year 1928 he won the Mathers and Haldenby prize for architectural design, graduating with honours in 1930.

At the completion of his studies, Mr Kaminker spent considerable time gaining experience with different firms of architects. On the staff of Wickson and Gregg, he worked with them on the plans for the new Toronto Public Library on St. George Street, and with Raymond Collings on the plans and building of Western Sanatorium.
