## Did Notable Work in the Recent Fort Frances Fire

R. H. Pick has been appointed Marconi sales engineer attached to the Winnipeg Office of the Canadian Marconi Company, according to an announcement made recently by R. M. Brophy, general manager of the Canadian Marconi Company.

The Marconi Company's activities in the field of radio communication have developed rapidly in western Canada and Mr. Pick's appointment will enable the company better to serve its customers in that territory.

Mr. Pick entered the service of Canadian Marconi Company thirteen years ago. During that time he has served as wireless operator on board ship, as engineer at the Marconi "Beam Wireless" station at Drummondville, and later as test engineer at the Marconi factory in Montreal.

About a year ago Mr. Pick was assigned to supervise the installation of the network of radio telephone stations supplied and operated by the Marconi Company on behalf of the Ontario Government, Department of Lands and Forests, in the Patricia area of North Western Ontario.

During the recent forest fires in the Fort Frances area, Mr. Pick distinguished himself by providing the only means of communication in that area. He assembled radio transmitting and receiving equipment in a motor car, drove into the forest fire area and set up an emergency radio communication service with tank trucks and pump crews, enabling them to receive instructions and directions from the chief ranger which proved of inestimable value.
