Mexican Bills Sold in Shops as Novelties

Ottawa R.C.M.P. Looks into Circulation in North.

Kirkland Lake, Nov. 30 - Following the reported passing of bogus Mexican pesos bills for good Canadian money here and in other Canadian centres, a Dominion-wide investigation of the circulation of the money is being conducted by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

A few of the worthless Mexican five pesos papers were passed in Kirkland Lake a few weeks ago and they were traced for a certain length of time but their local origin has not been discovered. The money, which is passed as a Canadian five dollar bill has a commercial value of only from 15 to 17 cents.

"The fraud is evidently being perpetrated right across the Dominion," R.C.M.P. headquarters at Ottawa said. "The source appears to be legitimate dealers in the United States who sell postage stamps and coins to collectors, but these bills have fallen in large volume into the hands of crooks."

Alarmed by the large number of Mexican peso notes being circulated in Toronto, police there have asked the federal government to investigate the source. Dominion authorities have been asked to communicate with Washington to investigate stores in Los Angeles where the Mexican bills are sold as "souvenirs." Toronto detectives say that these stores are shipping the bills here. They are purchased there at ten cents for the five peso and 15 cents for the ten peso notes.

Recently the branch office in Ottawa of one of Canada's oldest banks accepted three of these Mexican five peso notes in the rush hour. A large number of these bills have been circulated in Ottawa among merchants, with a cigar store chain listed as one of the victims. In the past month Toronto merchants are said to have lost upwards of \$1,000 in receiving the worthless greenbacks.

No further act of "passing the buck" have been reported in Kirkland Lake since the last bill was traced down over a week ago.

Christmas Service on T. & N. O.

Railway Preparing for the Christmas Holiday Season

While it is still a little more than three weeks to Christmas, the T. & N. O. announces arrangements made for the special service of the people during the holiday rush time. To handle the extra traffic usual at Christmas season, the T. & N. O. has planned extra passenger train service and some cancellations of regular service. Some of the changes, as outlined in the new time-table issued this week are as follows:

Train No. 47, from Toronto, on Dec. 21st, 22nd and 23rd, will operate in sections from North Bay to Timmins. First section will consist of baggage car, day coaches, cafe parlour and sleeping cars. Second section will include mail, express and day coaches.

No. 147, Porquus Junction to Cochrane, will operate in sections.
No. 49 will operate from Toronto, Dec. 24th to Timmins, Dec. 25th.
No. 49 will be cancelled from Toronto December 25th.

No. 151, due to leave Porquus Junction, 7:20 p.m., will operate on Dec. 24th, but will be cancelled on Dec. 25th.

No. 2 will operate Timmins to North Bay, Dec. 21st and 23rd, instead of Timmins to Cobalt as scheduled.

No. 46, Timmins-North Bay-Toronto will operate in section, Dec. 22nd, 23rd and 24th.

No. 146, Cochrane to Porquus, due to leave Cochrane 1:40 p.m., will operate in sections on Dec. 22nd, 23rd and 24th.

No. 148, Cochrane to Porquus, due to leave Cochrane 6:30 a.m., will operate Sunday, Dec. 25th, but will be cancelled on Monday, the 26th.
