These salespeople have been offering for sale rugs alleged to be genuine Oriental rugs obtained through forced sale and so offered at low prices. The rugs instead are just cheap imitations and people paying the terms asked by the salespeople are defrauded. It is believed that some of these salespeople have gone to the North and people in the North are warned to be on the watch for them. The advice is to disregard all stories, no matter how plausible, and not buy from salespeople for other than local firms or reputable firms elsewhere.
