Suggests Bombing from Sky Not So Effective

From what he termed a "worm's eye view" of actual bombings as conducted by the Japanese in China, Lt. Comdr. J. J. Hughes, who was in command of the U.S.S. "Panay" when that gunboat was sunk by Japanese air raiders a little over a year ago, declared in New York that civilians sheltered by trenches have a good chance of coming through air raids alive, provided a direct hit is not made in the trench itself.

Very few bombing casualties are caused by direct hits, he explained, before a meeting of the American Institute. The great majority of injuries are due to fragments and splinters of bombs that land near by.

Lt. Comdr. Hughes stated that Chinese defences against the Japanese air attack have been quite inadequate, although he had only praise for the courage and determination of the Chinese fighters.
