Reference was made twenty years ago to the steady influx of men from Sudbury and other points south to the Porcupine camp.

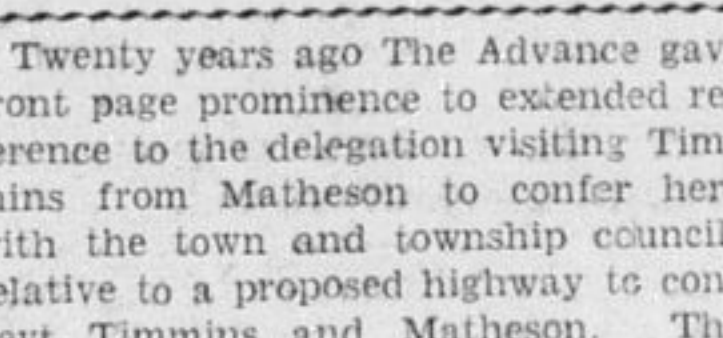

Timmins, Feb. 11th, 1939
