

If You Like Books (By A. H.)

Sunday, March 26th, was the 64th birthday of one of the greatest living American poets, Robert Frost. Robert Frost was born in San Francisco in the year 1875, the son of a father who was a New Englander and a mother whose birthplace was Edinburgh, Scotland.

In 1885 he moved to Lawrence, Massachusetts, where he attended public schools, and 1892 enrolled at Dartmouth College. During the years 1897-99 he was a student at Harvard, and in 1905-11 he taught English at Pinkerton Academy, Derry, New Hampshire. After that he was a teacher of psychology at New Hampshire Normal School at Plymouth, for one year, and in 1912 moved to England where he spent three years. It was in England that his first volume was published, and later his second works. Some of the work of his first volume was denied publication for twenty years, while parts of his second volume remained unpublished for ten years.

Upon his return to the United States he retired to a farm in Derry, where he took an active part in farming. In 1916 he once more returned to the field of teaching, being professor of English at Amherst College, Massachusetts, a position which he again resumed in the years 1923-25, after an interval as a poet in residence at the University of Michigan.

The poems of Robert Frost portray realistically yet with fine reticence, the everyday life in New England, his work as a whole partaking of the dignity of the serene beauty among which he has spent a great deal of his life.

The following are some of the works of Robert Frost: "A Boy's Will" (1913); "North of Boston" (1914); "Mountain Interval" (1916); "A Way Out" (a play 1917); "New Hampshire" (1923); "West-Running Brook" (1928); "Selected Poems" (1923); and "A Lone Striker" (1933).

Cobalt Councillor Now Recovering After Operation

Cobalt, Mar. 27.—(Special to The Advance)—The condition of town councillor James Lawrence, son of a former Cobaltier now residing in Porcupine, and who underwent an operation in the municipal hospital on Saturday, is reported to be favorable, according to Dr. H. A. Dunning, under whose care the councillor is a patient. Councillor Lawrence will be in hospital for some time yet, it was reported, and he will be unable to take up his regular work at the O'Brien mine, where he is engaged as hoistman, or to attend to his municipal duties, in the meantime. He will miss a special meeting of the town council called for this evening to engage a new chief of police. Councillor Lawrence has been complaining of ill health for three months past, and had been confined to his Lang street home for more than two weeks before entering hospital on Friday. His father, James Lawrence, senior, is living in Timmins.
