A model which has attracted much attention in the south and which will undoubtedly be adopted by Northern fashion leaders is the three button jacket, with or without a vent in the back. The three button model is supposed to be worn with the two buttons fastened.

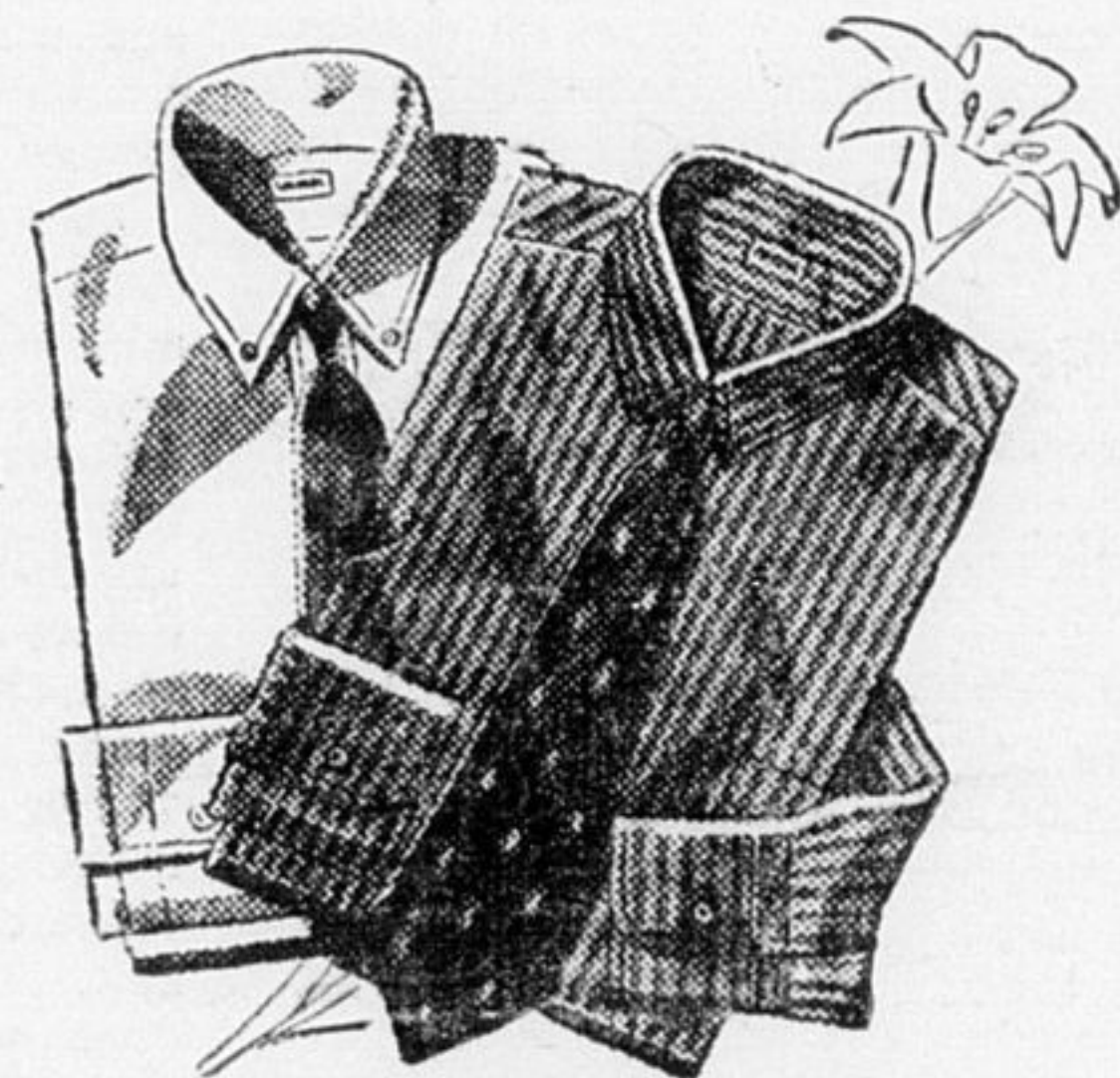
