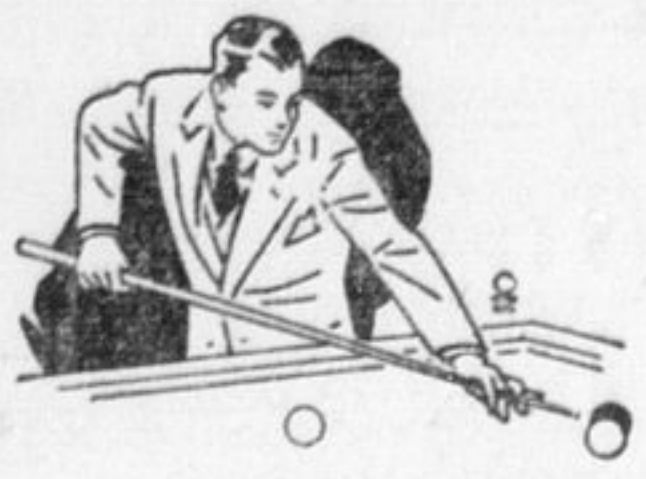

Accused of Selling Improper Radio Licenses at Ramore

Two Men Held at Matheson Jail on Charges of False Pretences.
Two men, Don and Jack Last, of Kirkland Lake, were arrested at Ramore last week on charges of false pretences and are held in Matheson jail for trial this week. The arrests were made by officers from Kirkland Lake after the men had been held at Ramore by Mr. E. Pion, manager of the Holytre townsite near Ramore. It is said that the men had centred their sales of radio licenses in the Ramore area, representing themselves as the agent for the Kirkland Lake collector of radio license fees. When the activities of the two men came to the attention of Mr. Pion he made enquiries as to their credentials and not being satisfied as to their authority or the methods used, he notified the provincial police at Kirkland Lake. While the officers were on the way to Ramore Mr. Pion detained the two men. They will appear in police court at Kirkland Lake on Thursday to answer to a charge of obtaining money by false pretences. In the meantime Constable Robt. Warner, of the R.C.M.P. is conducting further investigation into their activities.

Name of Diocese to be Changed to Timmins Diocese

Not Likely That Residence of Bishop Will be Changed
Haileybury, May 8—(Special to The Advance) Pointing out that any official information would have to come from Bishop L. Rheame, who has made no announcement on the matter as yet, a number of prominent Roman Catholics in this district nevertheless expressed doubt that the headquarters of the see of the Church over which his Lordship presides would be moved from this town to Porcupine, an intimated in newspaper despatches from outside points appearing recently.
Change of the name of the diocese from Haileybury to Timmins would take place, it was stated. Reason for this it was explained by one layman, is that boundaries of the former diocese of Haileybury having been altered by transfer of parts of Amos and Hearst jurisdictions respectively, the old district ceases to exist in its original form and a new name is bestowed. Choice of a name fell on Timmins, possibly because it was the largest single community in the diocese.
While there might be some readjustment of the bishop's relations with present headquarters in Haileybury, it was thought unlikely the diocese would be administered entirely from Timmins. Apart from any other factors which might enter into the case, opinion expressed unofficially was that Haileybury was a more convenient point from which to reach the various sections of the extensive area over which Bishop Rheame has jurisdiction than would be Timmins, located in one corner of the diocese.
The rearranged diocese includes its former territory in Quebec as far east as Cadillac and Malartic, it was stated, but all the country beyond there had been assigned to the new diocese of Amos, until recently part of this diocese. In Northern Ontario, the Hearst diocese is being extended eastward from Fredericton to the Quebec boundary and southward to within two and a half miles of Iroquois Falls, it was explained. This change leaves Cochrane out of the Timmins diocese.
