Buildings worth more than \$1,000,000 were erected in Timmins during 1938 according to a review of building permits issued. Although the total estimated value of building, according to the permits, totals just over \$800,000 the value of a proposed structure placed on the building permit is usually away below the actual building cost. Therefore it is safe to assume that 1938 building in this town topped the million dollar mark by considerable.

Close to half of the building was done during the months of April May and June, as is usual. Estimated value of buildings erected during that period, judging by stated permit values, was \$454,878. Period in which the least building was done was during the first three months of the year.


