

Leo Bandiera Breaks The Ontario Shot-Put Record

Records Topple on Saturday When Athletes from North Perform at New Liskeard

Eleven District Records and One Provincial Mark Fall Before Onslaughts of Northern Athletes in Successful Liskeard Track Meet. Leo Bandiera Surpasses Intermediate Provincial Shot Mark by 26 1/2 Inches.

New Liskeard, June 10—Under ideal weather conditions and before a large and enthusiastic crowd, the annual District Track and Field Meet of the Ontario Athletic Commission was held at New Liskeard on Saturday. Featured by a record entry of 142 contestants from Cobalt, Halleybury, New Liskeard, Englehart, Kirkland Lake, Schumacher and Timmins the meet developed into a parade of record smashing performances. In competition which was the keepest in the history of the meet, no less than 69 even district records and one Provincial record toppled before the onslaughts of the best crop of athletes the schools of the North have ever produced.

The outstanding performance of the day was given by Leo Bandiera, Timmins husky who hurled the 12 lb. shot a distance of 48' 4 1/2" to surpass by 26 1/2" the Intermediate Provincial mark held by D'Aoust of Ottawa. This mark is only 5 1/2" less than the Dominion Senior Interscholastic mark, and the 16 year old Leo is conceded a golden opportunity of bettering this record before his brilliant career at the Timmins School terminates.

Another sparkling performance was turned in by Humphreys, blonde speedster of Halleybury who set new marks in the Intermediate 100 and 220 yard sprints. Roman of Kirkland Lake lopped off more than 2 seconds from the Intermediate quarter of mile record to establish a mark even better than the Senior record. In this event he was pushed to the limit by Mark Burnett of Timmins, who although beaten by inches was also well under the old mark. The same Burnett had previously bettered the half mile mark by more than 3 seconds. All hurdle records fell at this meet, Ormston of Timmins in the Junior, Cacchino of Timmins in the Inter-

mediate, and Murray of Kirkland Lake in the Senior turning the trick. After Telkkinen of Timmins had added 4' to the Intermediate Hop Step and Jump record, Carlson and Doal of Halleybury completed the record breaking with new marks in the Senior 820 and mile runs.

As in the last three years, the Timmins boys dominated the meet. Out of the 32 events which made up the programme, they garnered 17 firsts, 14 seconds and 8 thirds. In total points scored, they piled up 135 to 53 for Kirkland Lake and 42 for Halleybury. In the Junior events Timmins led with 47 points followed by Kirkland Lake with 24. In the Intermediate division, Timmins amassed 55 points with Kirkland Lake getting 17 and Halleybury 14. Timmins also led in the Senior class with 33 points to 31 for Halleybury.

Individual champions were: Junior, Vertolli of Kirkland Lake with Stanley of Timmins a close second; Intermediate, Bandiera of Timmins, with Humphreys of Halleybury next; Senior, Lake of Timmins, with Carlson of Halleybury as runner-up.

As a result of their showing on Saturday, 14 of the 28 boys from the North who qualified to become the guests of the Ontario Athletic Commission at their fine camp at Lake Couchiching this summer are Timmins boys, Halleybury and Kirkland Lake were next in this respect, each with five boys qualifying.

An innovation of this year's meet was the introduction to the program of five girl's events. As a result of these events, five Northern lassies will also attend camp, two from Kirkland Lake one from New Liskeard, one from Cobalt, and Miss Vera Spencer of Timmins.

The people of the Porcupine camp who are interested in Track and Field events will be interested to learn that there is a good possibility of the annual meet being transferred to Timmins next year.
