

High-grade Ore on First Level of the Broulan Mine

Visible Gold in Last Eight Rounds in South Drift.

Broulan Porcupine Mines officially reports that the east drift from the crosscut 55 ft. north of the shaft on the first level has opened up over 40 ft. of good grade ore in recent work...

The high-grade material cut in recent diamond drilling on the first level reported last week, and in the east drift on the first level verifies the numerous high-grade intersections obtained in previous drilling from surface.

A summary of high-grade drill results show that the two recent holes from the first level at points 15 and 40 feet, east of the crosscut in the north drift intersected in the No. 1-7 hole 1-ft of \$743.75 ore, 2 ft. of \$225.22 ore and in the No. 1-9 hole 2 ft. of \$62.65 ore and 2.5 ft. of \$75.60 ore.

On June 1, the company had net current assets including bonds, of \$120,761, against current liabilities of \$15,983, Bert Lang, president reports.

Further Drilling on Mulven Lake Mines

Larder Lake Property Being Developed Under Advice of A. A. Lee.

Mr. Lee is well known in town and district having been on the engineering staff of the Hollinger, and later assistant chief engineer at the Lake Shore Mines.

The Mulven Gold Mines Ltd., is developing a mining property in the Larder Lake area. Approximately \$40,000 has been spent on development to date and diamond drilling has indicated a substantial ore body.

Plans Extended for New Fish Hatchery Near Charlton

New Hatchery the Only One of Its Kind in the T. & N. O Territory.

Englehart, June 29—(Special to The Advance)—Revision of the original plans which called for four ponds, to make provision for a fifth one which, in area, will be almost twice as large as any of the others, has resulted in a start being made on this addition to the equipment of the fish hatchery which is being constructed at Hill Lake seven miles from Charlton, for the Ontario government, a visit to the plant in making revealed his week.

The hatchery, the only plant of its kind in the T. & N. O. territory, will be completed probably late this season, although no estimate of the date would be hazarded by the contractor, who pointed out that weather conditions played a large part in this job.

The additional equipment, Mr. McLeod said, is to be a parent pond and will be used for spawning purposes. Located about halfway between the dam and the other ponds, which are set side by side at the north end of the property, it is in a hollow of the ground that makes a natural setting for the purpose.

At the north end of these ponds, provision is made for the hatchery tanks, of which there will be fifteen when the work is finished. Constructed of British Columbia cedar, of which wood there is a supply on the ground, these tanks each will be fifty feet in length, four feet wide and two feet deep, and they will rest on concrete foundations, which are in position in the excavation prepared for the location of the tanks.

May Use Air Beacon Building at Dane as Hospital Auxiliary

Kirkland Lake Hospital May be Given Dominion Structures.

On account of technical reasons the buildings constructed at Dane for air beacon purposes in connection with the Trans-Canada Air Service are not to be used now for this object. It is understood that the Dominion Government, considering that there is no likely sale of buildings possible at any fair price, is ready to turn over the buildings for worthy public purposes.

Present indications are that the Hospital Board will get the Dominion Government air beacon buildings at Dane to be used as a convalescent ward of the institution, according to Walter Little, M. P., who stated today that he had asked the department at Ottawa to put the deed in the name of the Hospital Board.

Mr. Little stated that a number of local women had been working for a long time in an effort to get the Ontario Government to establish a school in these buildings and for this reason he thought they should have a final opportunity to carry out their plan, if possible, but that apparently the Ontario Government is no longer interested in their proposals.

Canadian Lumber Programme Now Launched in Britain

Advertise Wood Products Under Banner of "Canada Calling."

Sale of Canadian lumber on the British market is expected to receive new impetus as a result of the decision to include this product in the "Canada Calling" campaign under which Canadian goods are advertised and merchandized in Britain by the Dominion Department of Trade and Commerce.

Announcement of the new lumber campaign reveals that it will have the full co-operation of the Eastern Canada and British Columbia Timber Commissioners who are resident in London, England, and will be directed particularly to the attention of British architects, builders and manufacturers.

Within the past two years real progress has been made in the building of all-timber houses in Scotland and England, and this development is expected to play an increasingly important part in the encouragement of Canadian lumber in the Old Country.

In addition to newspaper and trade paper advertising, the new lumber program provides for concentrated personal contact with key men interested directly or indirectly in wood or wood products. Supplementing these activities, monthly bulletins, outlining technical and other aspects of Canadian lumber, are being mailed to many groups including 7,539 registered architects in Britain; 6,751 chartered surveyors' institutions; 2,845 branches of the Institution of Structural Engineers; 2,277 county, borough, urban and rural councils; 428 housing directors, 2,360 builders or 2,800 manufacturers who use wood in their products.

It is pointed out that the advertising of Canadian lumber requires a totally different technique to that used in interesting the average British housewife in the value of Canadian food products advertised under the "Canada Calling" campaign, such as bacon, cheese and tinned salmon. At the same time, it is necessary to use different methods to promote the sale of British Columbian or Eastern Canada wood. Douglas fir, it is explained, is used largely for building purposes and if the chief commercial timber of British Columbia, white spruce, the principal export timber of Eastern Canada, is mostly utilized for making packing cases and boxes. Likewise, other types of lumber have their various uses.

PLATINUM FOXES FOR PLATINUM BLOWDES

Moncton, N.B., June 23—Platinum blondes will be able to have natural platinum fox furs to match their hair if the breeding propensities of a female fox on a chipman, N.B., farm continues and the strain can be stabilized, according to officials of the Canadian National Railways here. Two platinum foxes were born in a litter of three. One is bluish white and the other of a light straw colour. Platinum foxes are extremely rare and command high prices.

Roads to Mines in This District to be Improved

Projects This Year Under Auspices of Dominion and Province.

Honourable Paul Leduc, Minister of Mines for the Province of Ontario, has announced that the following Mining Roads Projects have been recommended to have been approved by the Minister of Mines for the Dominion.

- The Federal and Provincial Governments contribute to the building of these roads, their share being respectively two-thirds and one third of the total amount. Some other projects are now awaiting the approval of the Dominion Minister of Mines. 1. Improvement of a ten and one-half mile road from Nezah to Sturgeon River Gold Mines. 2. Improvement of a two-mile road leading from Highway No. 66 to Upper Canada Mines Limited. 3. Road on McKenzie Island, Red Lake District. 4. Completion of the winter road into Hawatha Gold Mines, Limited. 5. Improvement of a six and one-half mile road leading from Red Lake to the Madeson Mine. 6. Road from Tionaga Station to Horwood Lake. 7. Improvement of the road between Westre and Shining Tree. 8. Improvement of the road between Aikokan Station and Steeprock Lake. 9. Improvement of the road east of Gowganda and from Gowganda to the Tyrant Mine. 10. Road into the Albany River Mine. 11. Road from the highway east of Swastika to the Golden Gate Mine. 12. Road into the Hasaga Mine, Red Lake District. 13. Improvement of the road into New Golden Rose Mine. 14. Improvement of the road into the Naybob Mine. 15. Improvement of the South Road between Timmins and South Porcupine. 16. Improvement of the road between Cobalt and the Gillies Limit. 17. Improvement of the Canadian Lorrain Mine Road. 18. Road to the property of White Valley Chemicals Limited in the County of Peterborough. 19. Improvement of the road from Matachewan to the Young-Davidson and Matachewan-Consolidated properties. 20. Improvement of the road between Boston Creek and the Yama Mine.
