Body of Boy Recovered from the Veuve River

Sudbury, June 28—The body of Willie Prieur, 16-year-old son of Antoine Prieur of Markstay, was recovered from the waters of the Veuve River shortly after 4 o'clock Monday afternoon in seven feet of water between the boom on which he had been working and the shoreline.

Prieur was a sawmill worker in the employ of Frank McDonald of Markstay. His absence was noticed when his unopened lunch paid was found on the boom by other workmen returning from lunch about 2 p.m.

A pair of long rubber boots he had been wearing were also missing, and his shoes were found on the shore. Dragging operations were commenced immediately under the direction of Fred Rochon and the Provincial police were notified. An investigation has been started.

Prieur had been engaged in pulling logs off the riverbank into the boom and it is thought he fell and was carried under the logs by the swift current.
