

Baby Dies in Flaming Home Saturday

Believe Fire Started When Father Made Use Of Gasoline in Stove

Fourteen-Month-Old Baby Dies in Flames While Parents Unable to Get Into Blazing Building. Firemen Experience Great Difficulty in Getting to Scene of Fire. Lay 1,100 Feet of Hose.

Lillian, fourteen months old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Drummond, was burned to death on Saturday afternoon, while her agonized parents stood outside the blazing home unable to get to the child because of the flames.

Market Opened on Saturday

Market opened at the Curling Rink on Saturday, when many Timmins people visited the booths which had been erected to display the products of the local vegetable and fruit markets.

The baby was in a cot near the door. When firemen arrived and finally got to her she was dead—horribly burned about the whole body. They brought the body out and Coroner Dr. Minthorn pronounced her dead.

An alarm was put in immediately after the fire started and a truck set out for the address. A good deal of difficulty was experienced in getting the truck to the scene however, as entry to the townsite can be made not on Cedar street, of which it is the continuation, but only from Pine Street, above.

Eleven hundred feet of hose were laid. As there are no water connections in the townsite it was necessary to connect with a hydrant on Pine Street, during the dragging operations necessary to get the water to the fire one length of hose was broken. That further delayed the arrival of the water.
