Living With Broken Neck After Motor Car Crash

Kirkland Lake, July 19—The condition of Gordon A. Day, an employee of the McNamee Construction Co. at Camp No. 7, who was admitted to Kirkland Lake hospital early Sunday morning with a broken neck, is reported to-day as somewhat improved. The injured young man was a passenger in a car driven by D. C. Todd, of Kirkland Lake, where it was in a collision with another car driven by Harold French, also of Kirkland. The accident occurred at the Dane "Y" early Sunday morning. The cars appeared to side-swipe each other but neither driver was apparently able to give the police a very clear explanation of how the accident occurred. Both cars suffered considerable damage, chiefly to the fenders and sides, but neither driver was injured. At first it was not thought that Day's injuries were serious, but later it was seen that he was suffering from more than shock. Accordingly, he was taken to the hospital and there it was found on examination that his neck had been broken. After the extent of Day's injuries was learned, the police made thorough investigation of the accident to determine whether there was carelessness or negligence on the part of either driver. Up to the present the police have not preferred any charges against either of the drivers, but enquiry is being continued in regard to the accident.

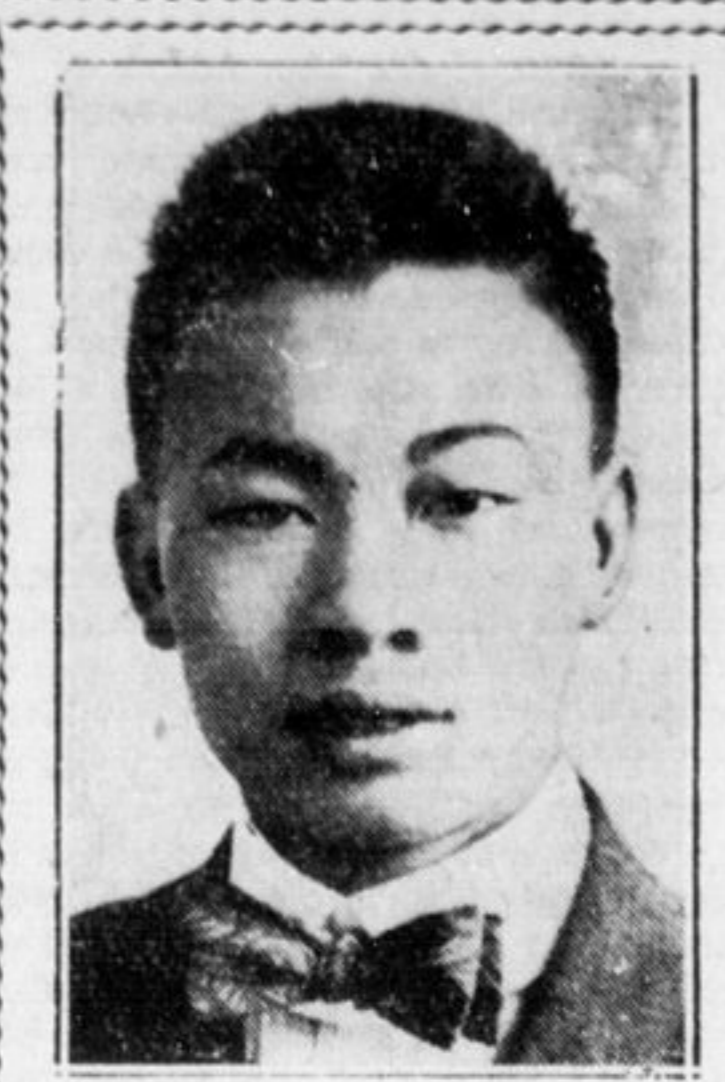

Mascioli Awarded Paving Contracts For Lanes, Streets

Warn Few Boat-House owners on North Side Matagami Bridge Must Soon Make Way for Beach.

The Mascioli Construction Company has been awarded contracts to pave six lanes in the business section of the Town and to construct this year's allotment of sidewalks. At a meeting of council on Monday night, resolutions were passed making the awards.

Price tendered for sidewalks was 19 1-2 cents a square foot with prices of \$1 per cubic yard for extra excavation and 75 cents a cubic yard for fill. Prices for lanes were: paving surface, \$2.07 a square yard, excavation, \$1.15 a cubic yard and fill 75 cents a cubic yard. Where excavation is used for fill the contractor will not be paid double.

It was announced at the meeting that the tender of the Mascioli company was lower by \$500 than that of any other submitted. Work will be started in the very near future.

Refuse Share Expenses
The firm of Caldwell and Yates, solicitors for the Town, asked for a share of expenses for a recent trip to Toronto. Argument was that while in the city they had visited the municipal Board on Town business. The request was refused by the Town on the grounds that no instructions were given the barristers to make the visit.

Members of the Christian Science Church asked for the use of the Council chamber on Sunday afternoon. Because of the fact that it is being used at present by the symphony orchestra, the Council was forced to refuse.

Warning was given that the Town intends to ask the removal of boat-houses on the north side of the Matagami bridge so that a beach can be built to extend up to the Town park. Due warning will be given owners so that they may find other accommodations.

Tuesday Next Week Tag Day In Tisdale

Tuesday of next week, July 25th, is Tag Day in Tisdale township (Schumacher and South Porcupine) for the civilians wounded and ill as a result of the war in China. There are thousands upon thousands of these wounded Chinese civilians and their plight is most pitiable. The Chinese Red Cross needs further money to carry on the work of looking after these unfortunate. The Tag Day next Tuesday affords opportunity to all humane people in Tisdale township to assist in the financing of the care of the suffering civilians in China.
