W. T. Sampson's Father Dies at the Age of 87

(From The Northern News) Friends of William T. Sampson, superintendent of the Wright-Hargreaves, Mine, learned with regret that his father, Rev. W. H. Sampson, died Monday, July 17, at St. John, N.B.

Rev. Mr. Sampson was 87 years of age and had retired from the ministry for several years but had enjoyed good health until his fatal illness. A message was received by Mr. Sampson of his father's serious illness a week ago Saturday. He took the earliest train connections arriving at his home on Monday noon. His father was unconscious and died in the afternoon without rallying.

Rev. Mr. Sampson was for many years rector of St. George's Anglican Church, in St. John.

Surviving him besides his son, William, are two sisters, Misses Etta and Fannie, of St. John.

Charge of Reckless Driving to be Laid Against Young Man

The coroner's jury into the death of Charles Young, aged 6 years, who died last week as a result of injuries when he was struck by a car driven by Wm. Flynn, brought in a verdict of accidental death with some blame attached to both driver and the child. The youngster ran out in the road in front of the car. The brakes on the car were not in perfect condition. Flynn explained that he did not see the child until too late to avoid hitting him. The jury added a rider to the verdict recommending that Flynn's license to drive be cancelled. Coroner P. C. Evans conducted the inquest. In the meantime the police had been conducting an enquiry into the case and are laying a reckless driving charge against Flynn.
