

Macmen Take Two Game Lead Into Series Today

Can Win T.B.L. Title Today As Second Win Yesterday Increased Game Lead to Two

Hargreaves Show Lack of Life and Fight in Both Games Played Here. First Game Shut-out For Pitcher George McShane. Yesterday Tony Paczkowski Combated Three Pitchers to Win Six to Four.

In both games they have played and lost with the McIntyre for the senior T.B.L. championship the Wright Hargreaves team has displayed a lack of pep. It did not seem to have the necessary punch to make a winning situation pay dividends in runs.

The first game, played on Tuesday afternoon, was a shut-out for pitcher George McShane. Yesterday afternoon Tony Paczkowski took over the pitching duties for the Macmen. He combated three hurlers and was hit twelve times, the same number as Sherwood, Blazetich and Biff Roach, who shared the Hargreaves hurling duties.

The six to four McIntyre victory yesterday afternoon gave them a two game lead in their best out of five series for the title. Today, in Kirkland Lake, they play the third game. A victory today will give the Temiskaming Baseball League title to the Macmen.

In addition to doing some good pitching for the winners Paczkowski was playing good ball while in the batter's box. He got three hits for four times at bat, one of them a double.

First Inning
Hargreaves: McIlroy was thrown out at first. Walton singled and made second on an outfield error. Jennings struck out and Cookson fled out.

McIntyre: Webber fled out to the catcher. Richardson singled and was thrown out when he was forced to second by Dunn's hit. Dunn was caught off the bag on a throw from catcher to second.

Second Inning
Hargreaves: D. Anderson, Fitzgerald and Schoenfeldt all were thrown out, short stop to first base.

McIntyre: McNeill walked and made second on Adams' single. He was thrown out, pitcher to third base, when Quinn connected. Quinn made first on the fielder's choice. Moran, took a base when hit by pitcher and Granberg fled for a squeeze play. Granberg was caught at first, and Thayer came home. When Quinn also tried to make it, however, he was thrown out at the plate.

Third Inning
Hargreaves: Reilly got on base on an error at short. In succession Sherwood, McIlroy and Walton were thrown out at first base.

McIntyre: Paczkowski, lead off man, hit a double to right field. He made third when Webber was thrown out at first but remained there when Richardson was thrown out at first and Dunn fanned.

Paczkowski was thrown out at second. Webber singled and Richardson fled out to retire the side.

McIntyre Smothers Timmins in Final Camp Title Game

McIntyre Wins Twelve to One After Eighth Inning Rally With Gain of Seven Runs. "Lefty" Grise, Having Pitched Two Games in Series, Not in as Good Form as Usual. Badly Shaken Up When Roughed at First Base.

After disputed games, protested games, postponed games, and after each team had a win and a loss, the Porcupine ball championship finally was decided at the McIntyre Park Monday afternoon.

Having pitched two games already in this series, "Lefty" Grise, gallant little Timmins hurler, was not able to give the performance he did in the first two games. The Macmen smothered the Timmins squad, and in a hectic eighth inning, smashed seven runs home.

Play by play account of the game is as follows:

First Inning
Timmins: Rodney singled to left field. Copps sacrificed and Chambers and McCann were thrown out at first. McIntyre: Webber was thrown out at first and Richardson and Dunn fled to the outfield.

Second Inning
Timmins: Grise was thrown out at first. Cordick singled and Wagar fled out. Poirier walked to send Cordick to second base and Stonehouse fled out to first base.

McIntyre: McNeill doubled to left field and Adams sent him to third on a sacrifice. Paczkowski singled and scored McNeill. Quinn singled and scored Paczkowski and then was put out at second on a throw from catcher. Moran fled out.

Third Inning
Timmins: Rodney singled over second base to make first sack. Copps hit a liner to second base. Quinn took it, tagged Rodney and threw Copps out. Chambers fled right to first base.

McIntyre: Granberg, Webber and Richardson all were thrown out at first base.

Fourth Inning
Timmins: McCann fled out. Grise walked and Cordick fled out. Wagar singled and Richardson's error at short sent Grise to third and Wagar to second and put Poirier on first. With the bases loaded, Stonehouse was thrown, pitcher to first for the third out.

McIntyre: Dunn fled out. McNeill singled and stole second base. Later, when a fly was batted out to left field the ball was thrown in by the fielder, Rodney, to Stonehouse, on third, to catch McNeill off the base and retire him. Adams singled and scored on Paczkowski's single which followed. Quinn got on base on an error and Moran fled out.

Fifth Inning
Timmins: Rodney singled to centre field and Copps followed with a single over third base. Chambers fled out and Rodney made two bases on McCann's single to score. Cordick was thrown out at first and Grise, who followed, also was out at first. When McNeill, McIntyre first baseman, took the ball he smashed the diminutive Grise with his shoulder, sprawling and shaking him.

Macmen Shut Hargreaves Out in First Play-down Contest

George McShane Hurls McIntyre to Initial Victory in Play-offs With Hargreaves. Macmen Smash Out Seven of Total of Eight Hits in One Inning to Take Six Runs. Wrightmen Use Three Pitchers Against Ike Solomon's Crew.

First game of the T.B.L. play-downs went to the McIntyre here on Tuesday afternoon at the McIntyre Park.

Bostonian George McShane pitched pretty ball for the Macmen to shut Wright Hargreaves out in the cold 7 to 0. He allowed the highly-touted visitors only four clouts and no one of them was better than a single.

In a big fourth inning the McIntyre smashed out seven of their total of eight hits, including a triple, for six runs. All of the Macmen but three scored, and Moran, who drove out the triple into left field, counted twice.

The Macmen drove three pitchers out of the Hargreaves box. Schmadeke opened but lasted only three and three-quarter innings when he was forced out. Fitzgerald replaced him but lasted only an inning until the Macmen began to get the range. Reach did a better job than any against the Macmen and held them hitless for the remainder of the innings from the fifth to the ninth.

The squeeze play worked and the run came in. Webber was thrown out at first and Cooke, who also tried to come home, was tagged at the plate for the third out.

Hargreaves: Walton was thrown out at first. Cookson singled and Anderson fled out. Schoenfeldt singled to put Cookson on second and himself on first. They were left there when McIlroy was thrown out at first.

McIntyre: Richardson singled and Dunn fled out. McNeill singled. Both men made bases on a wild pitch and both scored when Thayer singled. Quinn fled out and Moran hit a triple the only long hit of the game, to score Thayer. Cooke made a base on the pitcher's wild throw to first and Moran came home. McShane singled and Cooke and he came home when Richardson singled, his second one of the inning. Richardson was thrown out when he tried to make home on Dunn's centre field single. The peg caught him at the plate.

Fifth Inning
Hargreaves: Reilly and N. Anderson were thrown out third to first; Fitzgerald singled and Sherwood fanned.

McIntyre: Roach went in pitching for Hargreaves. McNeill got on base on an error and was thrown out when he rashly tried to make home. Adams and Quinn were thrown out at first.

Hargreaves: Walton fled out and Cookson was thrown out at first. D. Anderson singled but when Schoenfeldt drove to short the short stop relayed to second to out Anderson on the forced run.

McIntyre: Moran walked. Cooke, McShane and Webber all were thrown out at first.
