Kirkland Lake, Ont., Sept. 1.—McIntyre Mine won the Temiskaming Baseball League championship three straight here on Friday when the Northern winners defeated Wright-Hargreaves, 3-2 to take the pennant series in three games.

Wright Hargreaves Mine Police had to be called out to quell a player riot which broke out after the game when several Wright-Hargreaves players went after Umpire Coleman, of Timmins, for several decisions he made during the game.

Following that inning the game was held up on several occasions when Hargreaves players left the bench to mill around Coleman and protest his calling of balls and strikes.

The big McIntyre first sacker figured in the final run when he walked in the fifth, went to second on Thayer's single and scored on Quinn's sacrifice hit.

Chamberlain Tells of Progress of War

against Hitler was given by Premier Chamberlain to the British Commons today. It suggested the division of the fight into three parts—the air and naval attacks by Britain, the attack of the French forces on Germany's own territory, and the defence of Poland.

Premier Chamberlain said that the Polish armies were contesting every yard of ground against the German forces. "In the East," he said, "the Poles are fighting hard against a strong and ruthless enemy who is relying on weight of numbers and materials to crush all opposition."

The Premier announced that the Royal Air Force raid on the Kiel canal scored at least two hits on one of the German battleships.

Referring to French military activities in the Rhineland front, Mr. Chamberlain said:—"The understanding between the two countries is complete. Arrangements, which have now been put into force for co-operation in all activities in the war, are working smoothly and well."

The Germans claim to be driving the Poles back and to be within 20 miles of Warsaw. The Polish account denies this, saying that along the line the Polish forces are holding back the enemy.

The first hundred thousand of British troops are said to have been safely landed on French soil.
