New Trial for Donald McDonald in Windsor Case

Toronto, Sept. 27.—A new trial for Donald (Mickey) MacDonald will be arranged as soon as possible, Attorney-General Gordon Conant announced last night after an Ontario Court of Appeal judgment granted MacDonald a new trial. He was convicted May 20 of the murder of James Windsor, book-maker, and was to have hanged next Saturday.

"I have not yet assigned counsel for the case, but will do so without delay," said the Attorney-General. The case will have every attention, and will be given careful consideration by my department. I will see to it that it is brought to trial at the first possible Supreme Court Assizes.

New Comedy Drama "Maisie" Making Big Hit Wherever Shown

Robert Young and Ann Southern Star in Picture at the Palace

Robert Young and Ann Southern as a respective ranch manager and a honky-tonk showgirl stranded in a Wyoming carnival town, are the chief protagonists of "Maisie," the smartly-paced, clever-dialogued and well-directed picture showing at the Palace theatre Sunday midnight and Monday and Tuesday, October 2nd and 3rd.
