Santa Claus Recruits Firemen and Service Clubmen to Aid Him in the Porcupine

oxfords, dress pumps and ski boots. One characteristic of all of the clothing is that it is in good condition. No one has been mean enough to send a garment or a pair of shoes that is useless.

To do this work these firemen are taking time out from their ordinary duties, which will have to be done later-after Santa's work is finished. They are poised in the workshop and ready to drop their tools and dash for the brass pole whenever a call comes in. And they are managing to get a tremendous amount of work done. Row upon row of repaired and freshly painted toys hang on the walls, mute witnesses to their industry.

There will be many little boys and girls who will awaken on Christmas morning to find beside their Christmas trees gifts that look and function like new. It is very difficult, in fact, for the casual observer to distinguish many of the repaired and rejuvenated playthings from the brand new ones seen in store windows.

The most remarkable change takes place in a toy when it is brought into the workshop. First it is jiggled and shaken until it either shakes apart or any loose parts drop off. Then the firemen-workman takes what is left of the toy, picks up the pieces and examines them. If any part is broken or bent he straightens it, if it is deemed useless he looks speculatively around among the various sections of broken toys until he finds a part he thinks can be adapted for use. That part is worked over until it suits the purpose and it is fitted into place. When the toy has been made whole again it is again subjected to some more rough treatment. It is pulled and twisted around as a young boy might handle a toy. If it proves impervious to a moderate amount of ill treatment it is sent over to the paint bench where it receives a glistening coat of brightly coloured paint. The final result is often better than the original toy when it was taken off the shelf in the store. If there was any faulty workmanship then it has been rectified now.

Clothing that is soiled or creased when brought in is either washed or dry cleaned. Most of the dry cleaning firms in Timmins are doing this work free of charge and two laundries are washing soiled clothing as their contribution.

Firemen are working twenty-two hours a day on this job. The night shift, when it comes on, takes over from the day shift and the work never stops.

Tomorrow and on Saturday the work of distribution begins. It will be a task of huge proportions. Here again the service clubmen come into the picture. Their cars will all be out taking things to needy families; sneaking toys and gifts into houses so that the children have no idea of what is in store for them.

There is still time to help in this work. If any person in Timmins or the Porcupine has anything to give either in the way of money or toys or clothing let him communicate with the fire hall. There are about 300 families to provide for-a total of about 1,200 individuals and if everyone in the camp is going to get something out of Christmas other than an aching heart, those who are able will have to pitch in and help Santa Claus this year.
