

Gone With the Wind Are The Hair Dressings And Hats That Are Unrelated

Spring Hats This Year Have to Rest in the Hair and Not On It. Some Suggestions About Dressing the Hair in Harmony With the Hat and Suiting Hat to Hair.

Gone with the wind are the hats and hair-dressings that are not related to each other. No more miniature affairs perched at a rakish angle—a top a few strands of hair and held in that precarious position with elastic band or bit of ribbon! This Spring the hats have real backs to them, no matter how flighty they are in the front, and have crown sizes varied enough to fit all heads so that they will rest in the hair and not on it. And how do these new hat arrangements affect the hair? Only becomingly, because hairdressers have worked together with milliners in this matter with the result that even top curls can be accommodated or adjusted without crushing them.

Hats of the day and modern hair dressing when properly combined prove the charm of happy hat and hair relationship. It will be with one hat how the hair frames the face in a soft, flattering, rather wide frame, pompadour in effect around the sides and front. Yet it is smooth across the top and back so that the hat may fit closely to the head and allow for hair fullness at the nape of the necks. This is a very beautiful hair arrangement that

you are wearing the close-fitting chinon turban. As we have said earlier the hair arrangement at the back of the skull is as smooth-fitting as a cap—so that the "cap may fit" when you put it on.

There are various ways of wearing the hair below the hat at the nape of the neck. The mass there may be a smoothly rolled coil or a group of small, soft curls. For small hats the hair can be arranged as if a Juliet cap held all in place, the soft curls forming a frame around the head.

We shall be glad to see the last of that Hollywood drip, that long, tangled mass of hair hanging down below the shoulders, except on very young girls. Women have shunned it, but some girls (who really aren't) cling to this style with the mistaken idea that it makes them look younger and more romantic. In nine cases out of ten it merely looks slovenly and unkempt. So don't wince when your hairdresser gets his scissors out to trim off the long ends; he only is endeavoring to modify your hair into a better-groomed effect.

There probably has never been wider latitude in hair arrangement than there is this Spring. So it is up to every woman who aims to be individual to have her hairdresser design a becoming coiffure, keeping in mind the fashion points we have given so that her new Spring hat will look its best and feel most comfortable and secure on her head. If your hair has been permanently waved by an expert and is in good condition you can adopt any of the Spring's coiffures with whatever modifications your hairdresser suggests for your individual face.

Before the hairdresser cuts and shapes your hair prior to giving you a new permanent you may not get your hair and scalp into perfect condition by giving yourself several hot oil treatments? There is an excellent re-conditioning oil specially prepared for this purpose that, applied according to directions, will put your hair into the best possible condition to produce a perfect permanent. You can shampoo your own hair afterwards, finishing off with a special restorative color rinse that will clear away all oily film and bring lustrous highlights to your hair until you're ready to have it permed.

Test curls, several of them, are always made by a careful operator and only when the hair is in good condition will the permanent be given. Those who have the problem of very fine or thin hair will find that a good permanent will give it body and make it much easier to manipulate oneself. Remember, it is wisest to have the very best when contemplating the expense of it. Scientific advances continually are being made in the preparation and the solutions used. The very latest word in the cause of better and softer wave methods is the use of a specially prepared cream wave by a particular beauty salon.

This cream, rich in some substance that softens as it feeds the hair, is slathered on each separated curl before it is wrapped up in its silver foil, and worked into the hair until it will not absorb any more. Then it is given its very brief steaming—timed to the second according to gauge made by your test curl. The finished result after the shampoo and the set is a very delightful one and a wonder to you if your hair is of a dry or difficult type.

To keep your hair looking always at its best, if for any reason a shampoo must be deterred, we recommend the use of a remarkably effective cleansing tonic. It will, if used properly, leave the scalp beautifully clean and the hair lustrous and gleaming. Part the hair and hold it down with a comb while you rub the scalp with a pad of cotton moistened with the tonic. After the whole scalp has been treated with the tonic take a turkish washcloth, again part the hair and rub the moisture down each length of hair. Then brush the strands separately, wiping the brush on a clean linen towel after brushing each strand. Your hair will look and feel as though you had had a shampoo. If you are tempted to think that one way of brushing is as good as another do give this method a trial; you will be amazed at the effect on your hair and scalp. The point is, you must brush your hair up, not down, because downward brushing merely draws the blood away from the scalp and you comb your hair first the direction in which it is to be brushed. Gleaming, lustrous hair is promoted by unremitting daily brushing; which also promotes instead of harms the natural effect of the permanent waves and curls. A few drops of a certain hair-lotion on your brush or comb when finally doing your hair up will help to hold the wave and keep the hair looking groomed for a much longer period of time.

BALenciAGA TAN is a color you can wear with almost anything, because it is neutral in tone. Put together this large, flat, leather envelope bag, doekin gloves, a straw sailor with two spy feathers and tiny flat feathers lying on the brim, and the new gabardine-and-calf street shoes.

MILITARY BLUE is a cross between gray and French blue, a soft color to add to very deep navy. The suede hat turns up on one side with a small feather; the gloves are washable suede; the bag has a rectangular top; necklace and bracelet are twists of tiny shells.

Every Costume Has Its Own Particular Line of Accessories.

It's not difficult to add your spring wardrobe purchases up to an interesting total if you know the simple arithmetic of color. A poised appearance is the result of a carefully calculated choice of go-togethers in costume accessories. Sometimes the color of a print should be multiplied in accessories; again it is best when subtracted from. The trick is in being able to tell what color score tallies with sum total of an attractive ensemble.

It is fun to pick, to mix and to match, but you must know how to go about it. Such a small thing as a silk stocking in the wrong color may upset the equilibrium of a whole costume! Here are some hints which will keep you from going adrift in this season's sea of color.

First of all, before you begin to touch up your outfit get your tones lined up straight. Is your complexion result to portray a dark frock with spots of bright color or is it to be a symphony of pastels without dominance of any one tone?

Now, what are some of the tricks you can use to give individuality to your costume? Your tools are bags and gloves, shoes and hosiery, jewelry and gadgets of every kind.

SHOES AND HOSE

Let's start with shoes and hosiery for they take a sizeable chunk out of your budget and should be carefully chosen with an eye to your completed costume. Spring hosiery colors run the usual gamut of shades from one to ten, but the nuance of difference between each is slight. There are two general color groups to think about. The beige with a grey or tan cast, and the beige with rose tints. If your costume color is among the greys and pastels, choose stockings in the light beige group. If your costume is black, navy or white, the warm rose-beiges are loveliest.

Your shoes are a dramatic part of your costume this spring. You can repeat your accessory color in your shoes even to light blue and misty pink. A new brown called Copper Penny, by some, and Balenciaga tan, by others, are an all occasion shoe color. It is worn to compliment navy, black or grey. Worn with grey it is a stellar performer in the spring fashion picture.

Dark shoes with bright trimming as for example, bright blue edged in red are high-style for spring and present interesting opportunities for repeating an accent color, subtly. Red shoes are almost as generally wearable as ones of the dark colors, and will be seen more and more on city streets, though basically a resort and spectator sports fashion.

GADGETS SWAMP FASHION

Gadgets literally swamp the fashion horizon. Every costume gathers its jewelry and if you like the idea of pairing things that go together you can have a lot of fun in the selection of costume jewelry.

As a change from all the "daring" names given to perfumes in the last couple of years, a new one is called simply, Confetti. This is a sweet highly aromatic scent which clings and lasts longer than most.

This season you can be as amusing as you like in your choice of ways to trick-up a costume. There's no limit to what is permitted so long as it does not detract from your ensemble harmony. Some of the rules to remember are: Make certain that you have a basic color idea and let it dominate. For town wear, choose the background colors like grey, navy, brown or black and use color for arresting accents. Mix your pastels but let the whole effect be soft and muted. With prints let your background color key your whole costume.

Child Got Hold of Bottle Used by Father to Fill Cigarette Lighter.

Rouyn, March 16.—Georges Gingras, 20-month-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Georges Gingras, Stadacona road, died on Monday afternoon after he had drunk a small quantity of gasoline. The baby choked for a few minutes and was also poisoned by the liquid, both contributing to death.

Mrs. Gingras was out at the time of the accident and Mr. Gingras was sick in bed. He had got up for a moment, putting some gasoline in his cigarette lighter. The bottle containing the liquid was within reach of the child and when his father had returned to bed, the baby got hold of it, managed to open it and drank a small quantity.

Mr. Gingras rushed into the room when he heard the baby choking, did everything he could, and went out to a neighbor's to telephone for a doctor. The baby died before the doctor reached the house.

Going Back to Finland to Help Rebuild Nation

Mr. S. Alholm, one of the eleven volunteers from Timmins, who were scheduled to leave for Finland on Wednesday, but whose trip was cancelled when peace was signed by Russia and Finland, left on Sunday, on the Northland, to join his family in Finland, and to help in rebuilding the nation.

Mr. Alholm has several sons who served with the Finnish forces during the Russo-Finnish war, and he had planned to join them in aiding his native land. The Finnish people of the town provided Mr. Alholm with the necessary funds to make the trip, and many of them were present at the station to bid him farewell and to send their hopes for Finland to the people "at home."

He dragged him outside, rolled him in the snow to put out the flames and was preparing to put his father on a sleigh when his brother, John, arrived to help. Together, they got the injured man to medical attention and then to the hospital. This morning, his condition is reported as still serious.

The explosion threw burning gasoline over most of the roundhouse and when Noranda firemen arrived, the blaze had a good hold on the building. The only water available was from an emergency line and with this small amount, they
