### Watch Repair Booth in Drug Store Grows to Two Stores in Eleven Years

C. A. Remus, Born in Arnprior. Came to Camp Eleven Years Ago. Opened Store Here More Than Nine Years Ago. Now Has South Porcupine Branch and Staff of Nine to Meet Needs of Increasing Business.

Eleven years ago C. A. Remus opened a small watch repair booth in the corner of a local drug store. Saturday he will open a branch of his large Timmins business in South Porcupine.

Born and brought up in Arnprior, Mr. Remus learned his trade there. He left for a time to take an engraving course in Toronto and returned to go into partnership with the jeweller for whom he had worked as an apprentice. He remained in Arnprior for four more years.

From there he came to Timmins. For a short time he was in the employ of Louis Halperin, veteran Timmins jeweller. When he left that position he opened a small watch repair booth in the corner of Burke's drug store. Before long, his business had grown to such an extent that he was forced to find larger quarters. He moved to the location of his present Timmins store, and with one man as an assistant, established his business. That was more than nine years ago.

The business flourished and more stock was added to give patrons a wider selection. Four years ago the optical department was added and a year later a camera section was installed.

Mr. Remus has always featured fine china in his store and two years ago he was forced to find more space to

### German System for Rationing All Clothing Purchases

System Allots Rigidly Controlled Supplies.

The German system for rationing purchases of clothing, states the Manchester Guardian, as quoted by Public Opinion, is remarkable for its boldness and thoroughness and for the extraordinary degree in which the civilian customer's freedom of choice is limited.

Since textiles are one of the weakest points in the German armor, they were among the first to be restricted. Since August 28 a would-be purchaser has had to convince the local authorities of his need to buy before he has been given a certificate permitting him to spend his money.

The list of articles, with their coupon values, set out on the clothing cards are detailed here. A rough glance will show how little new clothing the German citizen will actually be able to buy with his hundred coupons.
