### Youthful Actress Plays Romantic Part at Cartier Theatre

Pleasing and Interesting Story on Screen Next Week.

After a sixteen-month absence from the screen, Nova Pilbeam, playing her first adult and romantic role in "The Girl Was Young," Gaumont production to be at the Cartier theatre Sunday midnight, Monday and Tuesday, June 17th and 18th, has at last obtained a role in which she is neither threatened with nor overcome by tragedy.

In "Little Friend," her first picture, she was called upon to attempt suicide. In "The Man Who Knew Too Much" she was kidnapped and menaced with death. As the unfortunate Jane Grey in "Nine Days A Queen," she ended a short life on the execution block on Tower Hill.

The masculine lead is played by Derrick De Marney, well known on the British stage; and an old favourite, Percy Marmont, has an important role.

A large part of "The Girl Was Young" was taken on location, the outdoor sequences centering around the rocky seaside country, where the location crew worked for more than a month.

### Asks Interment of All Alien Enemies Seizure of Weapons

Requests Presented to Toronto Council by Alderman.

Alderman Innes of the Toronto city council this week presented a list of measures which he requested the council to send on to Ottawa for the necessary legislation. The following are the proposals of Alderman Innes:—

Registration of all aliens in Canada.

Interment for the duration of the war of enemy aliens and those holding subversive views.

Confiscation of all enemy wealth and property.

Seizure of offensive weapons or ammunition in the possession of aliens.

**Urges Interment**

The motions read as follows: "That this Council being gravely concerned with the increasing possibility of the spread of subversive doctrines in Canada, thereby adding to the already tremendous peril in which our beloved Empire stands to-day, and being desirous that our Dominion be spared devastation and the horrors of enemy fifth-column sabotage, do memorialize the Government of Canada to require at once, the registration of all aliens in Canada, and the interment, for the duration of the war, of enemy aliens or persons known to hold subversive opinions against our Empire, and urge further that all enemy wealth and property in Canada be confiscated immediately and held in escrow pending the conclusion of the war, and that a thorough investigation be made by the proper Federal authorities into the

interest payment.

Tilley said the Abitibi mills now are running at more than 90 per cent of capacity and that this would be an ideal time for selling the assets.

### Decision on Abitibi Paper Co. Expected to be Made Shortly

Some Shareholders and Creditors and Provincial Government Opposed to Sale.

Toronto—Mr. Justice W. E. Middleton of the Ontario Supreme Court reserved judgment Saturday on an application by bondholders for a court order to sell the assets of Abitibi Paper and Paper Company, shown on the balance sheet at more than \$121,000,000. But the judge promised he would announce his decision "shortly."

The Montreal Trust Company, acting for first mortgage bondholders, sought the sale in the latest of a long series of moves by Abitibi investors to recover on their investment.

Preferred and common shareholders and unsecured creditors of the company joined the Provincial Government in opposing the application, asserting the present is no time to attempt a financial undertaking of such magnitude.

The Province's representative, C. R. Magone of the Attorney-General's Department, said the Government agreement giving Abitibi the right to cut timber in the Province was subject to cancellation.

**Running 90 Per Cent Capacity**

Magone said the agreement was signed June 24, 1937, and renewed March 9, 1939, with the specific stipulation that if the company had not been taken out of receivership by April 1, 1940, the Province could rescind the pact by giving six months' notice to the Abitibi receiver.

This notice of cancellation has been given by the Government, and if the agreement does finally die and is not replaced by a new setup satisfactory to Ontario, Abitibi will be left with only two timber limits instead of its present seven, Magone told the court.

He stressed that he had been instructed by the Government "not to make any threat or promise," but merely to suggest to the judge that the case be adjourned to give all interested parties a further chance to reach a mutually acceptable arrangement.

W. N. Tilley of Toronto, one of several counsel for the Montreal Trust Company, said those seeking sale of the assets represent about 60 per cent of all Abitibi bondholders.

The bondholders' claim now amounts to about \$72,000,000, including interest dating from June 1, 1932, when the company defaulted on a mortgage in-

### Motor Industries Doing Great Work in Canada's Part in War

Turning Out Large Quantities of Supplies and Equipment.

Ottawa, June 8—If the British Government desires it—and conversations to determine that fact are proceeding—the automotive industry of the Dominion can be swung into high gear immediately to replenish in vast quantities, the supplies of mechanized transport lost by the British Expeditionary Force in the recent battle in Flanders.

It was stated today by the Honourable C. D. Howe, Minister of Munitions and Supply that the motor car industry of Canada is already toed up sufficiently to turn out 60,000 pieces of military mechanized equipment a year. This production can be substantially increased.

The potentialities of the Canadian automotive industry to produce on a large scale are indicated by the fact that since the first of April some 7,000 pieces of motorized equipment for the armed forces of Canada have been manufactured and delivered by the Ford and General Motors companies alone.

Although it is not possible, for reasons already made public, for the automotive industry of Canada to manufacture tanks and heavy armoured fighting equipment of that kind at the present time, the production of gun carriers, trucks, and other vehicles necessary to support the Infantry, is possible on a large scale.

In the meantime, on Canadian account, it was announced today that work has already begun on another major motor vehicle order that will involve an expenditure of some \$13,000,000. The chassis and engines are being produced by Ford and General Motors, while other companies are engaged in working on the wheels and tires. Specifications for the special bodies involved in the order are being prepared.

This new order is in addition to the one for \$13,600,000 which was placed on March 20th, and which will be completed within a month. By far the largest number of the vehicles embraced by the first order are already overseas.

**Wants Arms Seized**

"That this Council respectfully petition the Federal Government to amend the Criminal Code of Canada to provide that during the period when Canada is at war, no aliens shall be permitted to be in possession of any offensive weapons or ammunition, with the exception that during the period in which game is permitted to be taken in any particular province, the Provincial Government of such province be authorized to issue to approved aliens a special permit for the possession during such period only of an offensive weapon to be used by the said alien for hunting purposes, only in the particular province affected."
