Hear Charge of Wounding in Court on Tuesday Next

Alleged to Have Shot Man in Arm in Week-end Affray.

Two charges, one of shooting with intent to wound or maim, and another of being in possession of an unregistered pistol, will be heard against Benjamin Van Brussel in police court on Tuesday next.

Charges arose out of an affair early on Monday morning when Alex Susner, 64, Toke Street, was allegedly shot in the upper arm when Van Brussel emptied his 25 calibre automatic pistol in an attempt to drive what he believed were intruders from his home.

On Tuesday morning last the charges against Van Brussel were read by Magistrate Atkinson and the hearing of the cases adjourned for a week. Bail for Van Brussel was set at \$2,000. Two sureties of \$1,000 each were provided by two different friends.

Early on Monday morning, Van Brussel told police, Susner and another man came to his home. They asked for beer and when he refused began to throw heavy rocks at his home. Thinking they would damage his property, he took his automatic pistol and emptied it. He fired the shots only to frighten the men but accidentally one of the slugs must have hit Susner in the arm.

The bullet went into the upper arm just below the shoulder. The brass capped jacket separated from the lead slug it contained. Physicians said today that the man's progress was good and that they did not expect any untoward effects from the injury.
