British Home Guard Answers Threat of Invasion by Air

Veterans are Backbone of New Force of 1,300,000.
(The Major-Gen. Sir Charles Gwynn, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O.)

The Home Guard, the new and better name for Britain's Local Defence Volunteers, has added 1,300,000 men to the forces an invader would meet... That is the greatest number that can for the present be armed and employed. There is a growing waiting list of men anxious to serve.

Weapons is nearing completion. Organization is simplified by the nature of the force. The section is the tactical unit. Sections are grouped into platoons, companies and battalions more in order to facilitate allotment of duties, training, supervision and administration than for tactical manouvre.

The Home Guards have a specific role. It is not the intention to organize them or equip them as a second line on the model of the regular Army... Their primary duty is to observe and report the enemy's movements, and to hold him in check till he can be dealt with by the field army.

Essentially the Home Guard is a well-trained auxiliary force distributed in small groups throughout the country... Each locality has its special problems which have to be dealt with in a practical manner, and with little of the uniformity of method which characterizes regular forces.

Obviously the training of an improvised force, most of whose members can give part time service only, presents difficulties... But these difficulties are greatly reduced by the fact that a large proportion of the men served in the last war.

They are men who were anxious to serve again but who, at the moment, are unable to join the regular Army. Their experience, however, fits them for their new role and they easily become masters of new weapons.

In preparing defences and in ready response to orders they have little to learn. The example they can set is invaluable guidance to the inexperienced. Naturally the arming, organization, and administration of this great mass of men has not been an easy problem.

There has of course been no question of arming them up to the standard of the national army. But even to provide small arms and ammunition for such numbers at short notice was a huge undertaking.

It is, however, being carried through rapidly and the provision of essential weapons is nearing completion. Organization is simplified by the nature of the force.
