Left to mourn his loss are his parents in Manchester, New Hampshire; four sisters, Laura at home, Mrs. Pierre Valliere and Mrs. Alfred Valliere, of Willimantic, Conn.; and Mrs. Alber Marcotte of Central Falls, R.I.; and two brothers, Nerie and Victor, both at home. The brother, Nerie and sister Laura were with Father Gelinas at the time of his death and will accompany the remains to Manchester.
