The campaign is to be conducted on a block basis. A team of canvassers is to be appointed for each of the 275 canvassing of every home in each block will be under the direction of the team appointed, the committee points out. To carry out this extensive drive, the

The president is confident that the people of Timmins will volunteer in sufficient numbers to make the campaign a success.


