(From Health League of Canada) It was a chance thought of Dr. Alan Brown, Toronto child specialist, that led to Ontario taking an aggressive stand against bovine tuberculosis. Now it can be truly forecast that the beginning of the end is in sight for a cruel malady that has brought untold opinion of the dire and urgent necessity of the step being takent

Medical opinion long was aware of the situation and tried to impress upon legislators the tremendous annual cost of permitting the sale of milk figureatively teeming with tuberculosis.
