London.-Among the heroes of recent German bombing raids on Britain is the captain of a small coastal steamer of The Netherlands merchant fleet, whose leg was almost torn off when he led his crew in fighting off four Nazi bombers. The captain will | be decorated with Holland's highest award by Queen Wilhelmina in person.

The bravery of this Netherlands seaman is typical of the resistance which the Hollanders still are opposing to their Nazi invaders. Even in Holland itself, the German authorities have not yet found a means to compel customer! in restaurants to remain when German officers take seats on the premises. In London, Queen Wilhelmina and her ministers are busy with plans for the revictualling and economic reconstruction of Holland, because they believe firmly in the eventual defeat of Hitler and his armies.


