



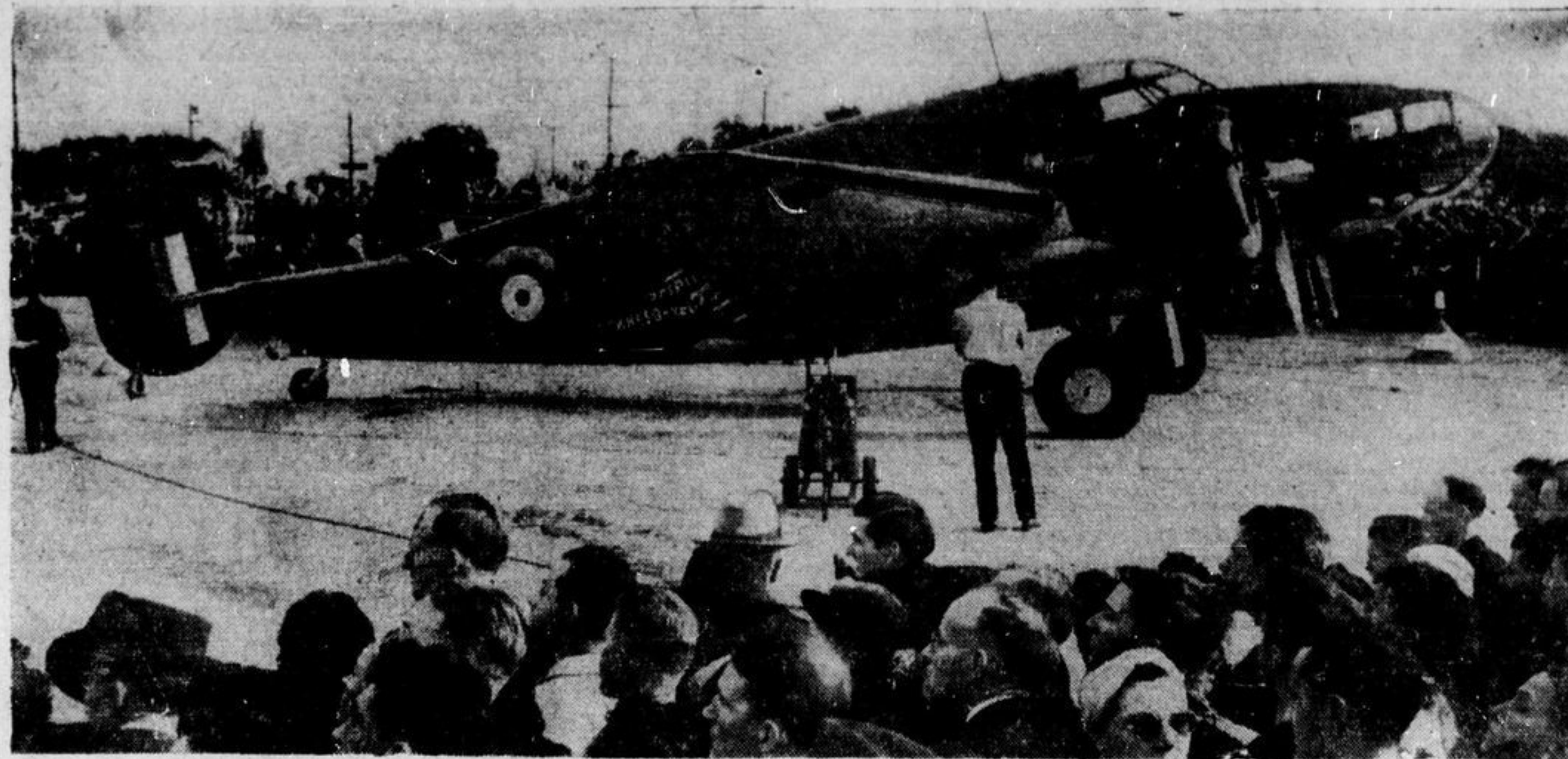

The Return of Frank James, an Exciting Colourful Picture

New Thriller Showing at the Palace, Jan. 3 and 4.

Filmed in spectacular Technicolor, the exciting and stirring climax to the daring exploits of the world's most famous outlaws will be at the Palace theatre Friday, Friday midnight, and Saturday of this week, Jan. 3rd and 4th, in the 20th Century-Fox production, "The Return of Frank James."

The story of "The Return of Frank James" is the story of Frank's determination to avenge the cowardly murder of his brother Jesse, shot in the back by the traitorous Ford brothers. Railroad money paid the Fords, and a gubernatorial pardon set the Fords free after a jury had convicted them, so Frank realizes the only way he can avenge Jesse is to return to outlawry.

Always maintaining a high pitch of excitement, the picture then follows Frank over all the lawless West, with tremendously stirring scenes of robbery, murder, gun-fights, man-hunts, train holdups, escape and pursuit.

Too, there are scenes of gentle romance. In Denver Frank meets and falls in love with Eleanor Stone, played by Gene Tierney. The girl perceives

Frank's real character and attempts to persuade him to give himself up.

The picture's climax is tense and dramatic—as Frank at long last comes face to face with Bob Ford.

Fritz Lang directed the film, with Kenneth Macgowan associate producer. The screen play was authored by Sam Hellman.

Noted Picture at the Cartier Theatre to End of Week

Crowds Delighted With "The Thief of Bagdad."

With Sabu, Conrad Veidt, June Duprez and John Justin heading a cast of thousands, Alexander Korda's mighty Technicolor spectacle, "The Thief of Bagdad," has been attracting big crowds at the Cartier theatre all this week since Monday. It is a United Artists release, and will be at the Cartier until Saturday, Jan. 4th. This picture, which was nearly two years in the making, was photographed entirely in natural colour and represents an outlay of more than \$2,000,000. Started before the war and completed in America's Grand Canyon, "The Thief of Bagdad" is said to be marked for a place among the film achievements of all time.

In addition to its romantic love story its vast canvas of pictorial sweep and colour, its Arabian Nights magnificence, its new Korda production is highlighted by a new kind of photography which brings to the screen for the first time an impressive array of magic devices.

As the story unfolds in the Eastern cities of Bagdad and Basra and focuses on the exciting romance of the Prince of Bagdad and the Princess of Basra, the amazing thief of Bagdad and the wily magician Jaffar engage in a thrilling battle of wits and magic. Thus there is seen on the screen the great Flying Horse, which soars through the clouds with remarkable ease; the enchanted City, which rises miraculously from the ground and reveals hundreds of gloriously coloured tents grouped around a lake of eerie brilliance; the Djinni, who is freed from a tiny bottle and becomes as high as the highest

mountain, towering over the beautiful city of Bagdad; the Black Galleon, mystery ship of the wicked Jaffar, with its huge red sails and an eye, six feet in diameter, painted on its prow.

Briefly, the story of "The Thief of Bagdad" describes the obstacles which interfere with the romance of June Duprez, as the Princess, and John Justin, as the Prince, and how these obstacles are overcome by Sabu, the amazing little thief. "The Thief of Bagdad" was directed by Ludwig Berger and Michael Powell, and William Cameron Menzies acted as production designer.
