Peg British Food Prices To Burn Profiteers' Fingers

London, England, Jan. 8 - Lord Woolton, Minister of Food, has announced the "pegging" of the price of foods, notably coffee, cocoa, chocolate, canned and boiled vegetables, canned pork and beans, poultry, tapicoa, canned soups, processed cheese, etc. Wholesalers are forbidden to sell at prices higher than last Dec. 2nd. Britain has a temporary meat shortage. Anti-profiteering plans are designed to "burn the fingers" of the profiteers, Lord Woolton suggested. Lord Woolton also said that most of the quering for supplies had been for unrationed items such as eggs and onions.
