McIntyre Hold Top Position in Local Senior N. O. H. A. Race by Single Point. Rink Packed to Capacity Friday Night to See Top Place Teams in Action.

Before a crowd that packed McIntyre arena to capacity on Friday night, Buffalo Ankerite Bisons defeated McIntyre Miners 2-1 to climb within one point of the league leading Macmen. It was a great game of hockey and the big crowd of visiting curlers saw a performance that had everything.

George Lever and Petrucci got the spotlight in the second period when they put on a centre-ice exhibition of punch throwing. A fight between spectators and players on the Ankerite bench was another feature that had the big crowd howling. Roy Fritz, of golf and hockey fame, seemed to be in the foreground among the spectators. During the melee he was "clipped" over the head with a stick and had to be dragged away for a patching up.
